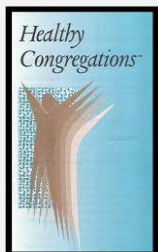

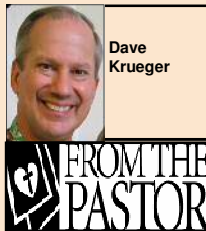
## **HEALTHY CONGREGATIONS WORKSHOP**

On Saturday & Sunday, January 25-26, you are invited to participate in a “Healthy Congregations” workshop here at KLC, which will be led by Pastor Paul Kirchner, from Lihue Lutheran Church, Kaua’i. The workshop will begin at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, running until 12:00 noon. On Sunday it will continue from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m.

Why should you attend? As KLC continues to grow and change in many ways, that growth and change can have an impact on how we live, serve, and communicate with each other. Rather than going through that growth in a way that breaks down the relationships we share and ministry we carry out, we want to make sure that we use the healthiest ways possible to talk and work with each other in the midst of differing viewpoints and opinions about how we can best be the church in this place. This workshop will give us the tools and insight needed to be the healthiest congregation we can be.



## ALOHA FROM PASTOR DAVE



Each year the World Council of Churches invites congregations around the world to observe a "Week of Prayer for Christian Unity", sometime between the dates of January 18-25. The purpose of this week is to have Christians from many different denominations recognize the great diversity there is within the Christian faith, even as we all worship the same Triune God. It's an opportunity to learn that our Christian neighbors aren't as different as we sometimes think they are. It's a chance to grow stronger in our grasp of what it means to be part of the Christian Church.

For the past few years the Kihei clergy that meet on a monthly basis have talked about holding such a worship service during this "Week of Prayer for Christian Unity". Such a service has been held among the Christian churches on O'ahu. But to my knowledge, there has never been such a service on Maui. This month, that will change.

**On Wednesday, January 22, 7:00 p.m., at St. Theresa Catholic Church**, a special worship service will be held as we celebrate the unity we share in Christ Jesus. Plans are in the making to have the choirs from KLC and St. Theresa, along with anyone from Trinity Episcopal Church by-the-Sea who wants to participate, join together to provide a musical anthem for the service. In the same way, conversations are taking place between the choir from the Kihei Tongan United Methodist Mission and the Tongan choir from St. Theresa, to offer a song together. Following the service there will be a reception.

This matter of sharing worship together actually started a handful of years ago when our four Kihei congregations began to do mid-week Lenten services together. The over whelming response from everyone who attended was, "Why haven't we been doing this for years?" It was obvious that most of the people who participated thoroughly enjoyed worshipping with friends and neighbors from the other churches. To have a shared worship service during the "Week of Prayer for Christian Unity" seems like the next natural progression in the process of building relationships and friendships between our congregations.

I know that the temptation will be to not attend this service. It's on a Wednesday night. It's at a church other than KLC. But I truly ask that you make the time to join this very special service. It will be one way to grow in our personal understanding of what it means to be a Christian. It will also show our community that the churches in Kihei have a strong and growing connection between them. God be with and bless you as we head into 2014!

## Back pack Buddies

Backpack Buddies at Kihei Elementary School is a significant program of Kihei Lutheran Church outreach Committee.

It is specifically designed to provide nutritional support for children at Kihei elementary school who have been identified by the teachers as at-risk students. Many come from large families. Starting with 25 students in September our program has grown to serve 64 students in December.

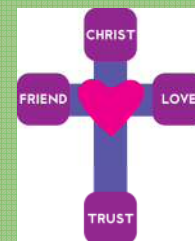
Once or twice a month a team of KLC volunteers meet at the Maui food bank. There we fill back pack bags with 2 breakfasts, 2 lunches, and 2 single serving dinners plus a nutritional snack. These bags are distributed to the children every Friday for the week end. With donations of food and money from the congregation, and the support of the Maui food bank we are able to sustain this program, and encourage its growth.

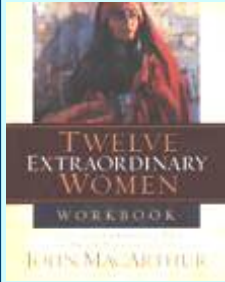
The THIRD Sunday of the month is designated as BACK PACK Buddy Sunday. We ask the congregation to bring single serving, child friendly, nutritional food and snacks and place them on the alter. Appropriate for this food drive include single serving cereal, and oatmeal packets, Individual apple sauce and fruit cups, chef Boyardee single serve meals, tuna, and granola bars. ## Adult Bible Study in January will begin Kerygma

This is the study of the whole Bible and how it all "hangs together" with one message in 10 themes and 66 books written and translated over a 5000 + year time span. This is an intense program that usually takes 45 weeks to complete. We will do it in 12 weeks. Yes, you read that correctly....cut nearly 3/4 of the time... but not the content.

For those of you who may have completed a Kerygma class in Canada, Australia or New Zealand in the 70's or 80's this will be a refresher course.

Those new to Kerygma will enjoy a complete overview of the Bible. You will be encouraged to learn verses and the names of the 66 books. You will be motivated to learn the stories and their relevance to God's Plan as well as vocabulary words whose meaning currently fly over your head with question marks attached. "Bible Literacy" is the goal of this study.

Keryx in the Greek New Testament means "herald; one who proclaims news. Kerygma pertains to the message that is proclaimed. See Romans 16:25 & 26.
