If you've been closely following the Sunday worship Gospel readings from Luke, you will notice that at chapter 9, verse 51 Jesus begins His journey to Jerusalem. There is a distinct shift here, which scholars divide into two parts: His ministry in Judea, and His ministry in Perea (a region east of the Jordan River, north east of the Dead Sea). This section ends with Jesus crossing the Jordan and entering the city of Jericho, where he meets up with a tree-climber/tax collector named Zacchaeus (chapter 19, verse 1). During July and August, all of our Gospel readings will be taken from this section of Luke.

In Luke 9:57-62, Jesus challenges those who would follow Him and become His disciples by telling them that He has no home, that other things are more important than taking care of family matters, and that the proclamation about the kingdom of God is the highest priority. Sometimes we lose sight of this priority, and let other things get in its way. We sometimes get so caught up in our pasts that we fail to see the opportunities of the present and God's vision for the future.

We may inadvertently let the cares and riches and troubles of life detract us from following Jesus, so sometimes we need to re-focus on the spiritual things that really matter. Like proclaiming to others (family members, co-workers, children, even grocery clerks) the Good News that Jesus is calling them also to come and follow Him.

Luke himself was a traveler (he met St. Paul in Troas and continued with him throughout the Mediterranean, all the way to Rome) and so He writes about Jesus' journey to Jerusalem with all the anticipation and resolve that both the disciples and Jesus had. Jesus went to Jerusalem for a purpose: to suffer and die on the cross so that we would be forgiven of our sins, and be raised to life again to assure us a new and eternal life with Him.

By reading and hearing Luke's account of Jesus' travels, we can join with Him as He preaches, teaches by parables, heals, and brings to us the kingdom of God.

## MEET KICK

Celebrating a milestone birthday on June 29 was frequent KLC worshipper JOHANNA TERLUIN, affectionately known as "Kick." We all know her as Zel's Mom. Born, raised and educated (parochial school and trade school) in the Netherlands, she became quite the seamstress, and later (1948) became a secretary in the personnel department of the Phillips Corporation in Eindhoven. It was there that she met her

future husband JAN, who had been a prisoner of war in Indonesia during World War II.

They married on May 12, 1954 and were blessed with two sons, ZEL and JASPER (now deceased), and the whole family took on a great adventure in 1961 when they emigrated to Palo Alto, California where JAN worked in the infancy of the electronics field (radar, etc.). Always moving westward, after a vacation to Hawaii in 1980, they moved here and became resident managers at the Pikaki condo complex on the west side. After 14 years of hard work as managers, they moved to Kihei in 1999, in order to "retire." JAN was called to his heavenly home in 2011.

Both JAN and KICK loved to travel, and once took a trip around the world. She said that she had a good life, that she can't complain...and that shows her living, vibrant faith in God, who saved her (and us) through the offering of his Son Jesus to take away our sins.

On Sundays she can always be found in Church, worshipping with her family of faith at KLC. On Thursdays you can watch her knitting prayer shawls to be given away to folks who need the assurance of God's love surrounding them.

If you want to hear some interesting stories about her work for the Dutch underground during WWII, spend some moments with her. It will be an exciting time for you!

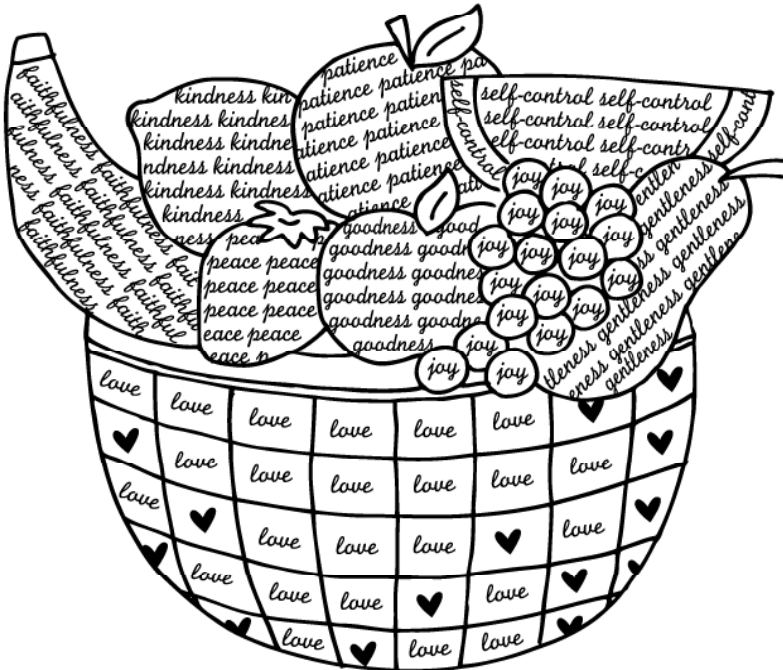

## FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT SNACKS

Bring joy to a friend by sharing a "peace" of this yummy dessert!

### What you need:

- adult help
- two 8" cake pans
- cooking spray
- 9 cups mini marshmallows
- 6 tablespoons butter
- food coloring (green and red)
- 9 cups crisp rice cereal
- mini chocolate chips



### What you do:

1. Spray cake pans.
2. Melt 4 cups marshmallows and 2 T. butter in microwave or on stove top. Add green food coloring. Stir.
3. Pour 4 cups cereal into bowl. Add green mixture. Stir with buttered spatula.
4. Put half into each pan and press along the sides with buttered hands.
5. Repeat using 5 cups marshmallows, 4 T. butter, 5 cups cereal and red food coloring.
6. Press half into the center of each pan, leaving a narrow outside border of green. Smooth the top.
7. Press mini chocolate chips into the red mixture.
8. Let cool. Then cut into wedges. Enjoy!

## YOUTH NEWS KAUAI SERVICE TRIP

Thank you to all of our generous donors who supported this trip in finances and prayer. The 18 KLC youth participants (and three chaperones) of June's Kauai Service Trip partnered with Lihue Lutheran Church's youth group and leaders to serve the island for a week. These youth have servant's hearts and worked incredibly hard. We also found a bit of downtime to have campfires, play silly games, eat shave ice at Jo-Jo's, and sled down hills covered with pine needles. Here are highlights of the good works our youth did in Kauai:

### **Lihue Lutheran Church:**

Painted the Fellowship Hall Exterior & Ceiling

### **Habitat ReStore:**

Delabled and priced donations from a vendor; Swept and cleaned shelving and displays

Moved, cleaned, and created displays for clothing; arranged linens, organized displays

Environmental Project-Recycled cardboard; landscape maintenance & weeding

### **Habitat Repair and Renovation Beniamina Home:**

Learned about construction site safety; Primed siding; Painted entire home

Worked alongside the homeowner; Site clean up, cleaning brushes and rollers

### **Habitat Repair and Renovation Nakaahiki Home:**

Installed skirting: measured/cut boards, installed with hammer, painted skirting & trim

### **Habitat Repair and Renovation, Habitat owned home:**

Painted entire home and trim; Primed & painted entire fence

Cleaned and maintained paint brushes, rollers & painting supplies

### **Koke'e State Park:**

Removed 300 strawberry guava trees (invasive species)

Peeled bark from branches to make 300 walking sticks to be sold in their retail store
