Time and Talent Sheets



ALOHA FROM PASTOR DAVE



I've currently got a partially broken computer sitting at home. What's known as the optical drive (the drive you put a CD or DVD into) is not working very well. Sometimes it will read the disc. Other times it won't. I know what I need to do. I've called the repair shop and will have to take it in to get it fixed – restored back to its original working condition. That's the way it works. The material things we have in life break. We then take them somewhere to get them repaired/ restored.

But what about our lives? We know where to go to get broken things fixed. But where do we go when our lives are broken and need restoring? Starting with Ash Wednesday worship (March 5, 7:00 p.m. at KLC), and then continuing for the five Wednesday nights that follow, we will take a look at some answers to that very real, very deep question as we unpack the Lenten theme of "Restored in Christ". Here's the schedule for each of the Wednesday evenings of Lent:

Ash Wednesday - "Broken Hearts Restored" • Joel 2:12-14 Our hearts are broken in sorrow over sin;

Christ restores our hearts through his forgiveness.

Week 1 – "Broken Vessel Restored" • Mark 14:1-9

A broken vessel holds costly perfume; we are broken vessels restored when Christ pays the price for us on the cross.

Week 2 – "Broken Trust Restored" • Matthew 26:14-25

Judas breaks his trust with Jesus by betraying him; our broken trust is restored through the sacrifice of Christ.

Week 3 – "Broken Bread Restored" • John 6:48-58

Bread is broken at the Last Supper; we are restored through the Bread of Life, Jesus.

Week 4 - "Broken Promises Restored" • Matthew 26:69-75

Peter's broken promises to never deny Jesus are restored by the surpassing love of Christ.

Week 5 - "Broken Justice Restored" • 2 Corinthians 5:20-21

A broken justice system put Jesus on the cross; we are restored when by his death we are declared not guilty.

None of us are exempt from having places in our lives where brokenness occurs. The promise that we hear again this Lent is that through Christ's death and resurrection he offers his grace and love, which is capable of restoring us in those areas of our lives where we are broken. I encourage you to use these weeks to be reminded of that truth in your life. May God be with and keep us all at this special time of the year!

NOISY OFFERING FOR TONGA

Sunday, March 30th is the fifth Sunday of the month. It is KLC's practice to receive a "Noisy Offering" whenever there's a fifth Sunday of the month, so that will be the case on that day. As part of the Keiki Message at both services, the keiki will be given tin cans and asked to go throughout the congrega tion, collecting any loose change that worshipers have with them. In prepara-

tion for that, you are asked to start setting aside all of your change leading up to March 30th, and then bring it with you to worship that morning. "Silent Money" (checks and paper bills) are also welcome.

March's "Noisy Offering" will be given to the rebuilding efforts of the Ha'apai Islands of the Kingdom of Tonga, following the devastation of Cyclone Ian that hit the islands on January 12th. Whatever is raised will be given to the Hawai'i Tongan Association of Maui, a non-profit corporation that has been organized to raise funds to help with the rebuilding efforts.



With the expansion of the KLC facilities, the seating capacity of the worship area will be greatly increased. That means there will be a need for 75 additional pew chairs, costing \$100/chair. Would you be willing to purchase one of those seats for the expanded worship space? If so, please make out a check to Kihei Lutheran Church in the amount of \$100, and mark "Pew Chairs" in the memo line. Then place that check in the offering bowl on Sunday, or mail it to the church at 220 Moi Place Kihei, HI 96753. Mahalo nui for your kokua (help) with this important part of the facilities expansion.



MIDWEEK LENTEN SERVICES

Once again, four Kihei congregations will come together during the season of Lent to share in special midweek services. The 4 congregations include KLC, Kihei Tongan United Methodist Mission, St. Theresa Catholic Church, and Trinity Episcopal Church by the Sea.

This year's theme, "Restored in Christ", is intended to help us use the season of Lent to face together the brokenness of our lives and our world, and then turn that brokenness over to Christ so that we can be restored by him through the cross. Each service in the series focuses on a certain event in the Lenten story and takes a good, hard look at a broken element from that particular story. Coming to an understanding of how each of these broken elements in these services leads to restoration in Christ is the key to understanding what it ultimately means to live today as new creations in Christ.



Five Finger Prayer

friends, and classmates.

Pointer (people who point the way) These are leaders in your life, such as teachers and pastors.

Offer God your thanksgiving for them and ask him to help them in their important work.

Tall Finger (people in authority) The big people in the world need prayer too. Ask God to give wisdom to our government, military, and police.


Ring Finger (people who are weak) This is your weakest finger. We should remember others who are sick, live in poverty, or are treated badly. Pray that God would give them new strength.
