
MATCHING FUNDS DRIVE TOPS \$100,000!

Following the announcement of a \$250,000 gift from an anonymous donor's estate, to be used for the sole purpose of expanding the congregation's facilities, a drive was organized to raise the needed matching funds during the months of April and May. At the end of March over 500 invitations to participate in this drive were mailed out to KLC members and friends. As of the end of April, approximately \$104,000 of those matching funds has been received. Mahalo ke Akua / Thanks be to God! Mahalo nui as well to the many people who have responded with gifts of many different amounts as they have been able. It's only as we all get involved that this drive to raise the matching funds will become a reality. Please remember that every dollar you give will be matched, doubling the funds that KLC receives for the planned expansion of the facilities.

ALOHA FROM PASTOR DAVE

Lately there's been a whole lot of talk going on around KLC. And you know It doesn't bother me in the least bit! As a matter of fact, I'm someone who's doing it. That's because the kind of talk I'm referring to isn't gossip. Rather, it's talk about the amazing things that are going on around the congregation. It's got to do

with the different ministries that are happening at KLC, and the excitement that those ministries are generating.

Take Holy Week and Easter for example. At the joint Maundy Thursday service there were 90 people in attendance. Or how about Good Friday where we had a record 134 people? And speaking of records, how about the 470 we saw in worship on Easter? That's not to mention the 25 keiki we saw come forward for the Keiki Message at <u>each</u> of the two services that morning (that totals 50!). On top of that there were the dozens of youth that attended the Resurrection Celebration in between the two services.

There's also been talk going on about the expansion of the KLC facilities, and the accompanying Matching Funds Drive. Ever since the February congregational meeting took place, the Building Team has been talking over different approaches to expanding the sanctuary space to accommodate more classrooms, more seating for worship, more offices, and more storage. They have come up with some great ideas which are being put into drawings so that the congregation may look at them and add their thoughts. As a result, a congregational meeting has been scheduled for after worship on <u>Sunday, May 27th</u> (see related article on the front page), where everyone will be encouraged to take a good look at the plans and offer their insights and suggestions. They're also going to be asked to vote on a motion to enter into a contract with architect, George Rixey. Again, there will be allot of talking going on.

And how about the Matching Funds Drive? First off, people are still talking about the fact that someone's estate gifted the congregation \$250,000 for helping with the expansion of the facilities. What an absolutely amazing gift that is from God through this anonymous donor! Then there's the fact that one month into our drive we have received over \$100,000 in matching funds from members and friends of KLC – gifts of every size (again, see the front page of this newsletter). That's certainly something to talk about! And I'm sure we'll continue to talk about it as that amount grows due to the generosity of many different people.

Finally there's the matter of adding an additional staff person at KLC as a Director of Youth & Family Ministry. The job description has been posted nationally in a number of different places. And we're starting to receive some resumes. The talk that I'm hearing is filled with excitement about how having this additional staff person will enhance and strengthen what's already happening, along with expanding ministry possibilities.

Now, here's the bottom line. As exciting as all of this talk is, and as tempting as it is to focus that talk on everything that's going on at KLC, the main reason for all of it is so that we can be talking about some<u>one</u> else. As we enter into the month of May, we are still in the season of Easter. We are still gazing at that empty tomb and proclaiming (talking about) "Christ is risen, he is risen indeed!" That's what the foundation of all of our talk is to be about. When all is said and done, it's not about attendance, or building plans, or matching funds, or additional staff. It's about Jesus Christ, crucified and resurrected for us. That's what we're to be ultimately talking about. And that's my prayer for each and every one of us. Yes, let's talk allot around KLC. Let's talk about all of the exciting things that are going on. But let's first and foremost talk about the resurrected Jesus – to each other, and to all those around us. May God's Holy Spirit so help and guide us!

GIFTING CAN BE SIMPLE

Many people would like to gift funds out of their estate to KLC or other charities, but are perplexed by the legal hassles involved. Actually gifting can be as simple as a one line entry to a codicil to your will. A codicil is merely a revision to a will and usually needs to be notarized, but the language can be quite simple. For example, you can use language similar to the following:

"I direct that x dollars be gifted to the Kihei Lutheran Church Endowment Fund for use as the Fund Committee deems appropriate." -or-

" I direct that x dollars be gifted to the Kihei Lutheran Church General Fund to be used as the Church deems appropriate."

Of course, you should seek professional advice from your attorney, or call Gregory Shepherd, our Regional ELCA gifting expert, at <u>909-910-6823</u>.
