KLC WORSHIP SCHEDULE


Due to the expansion of the KLC facilities, which is officially underway, the Sunday worship schedule will shift to **two services at 8:00 and 10:30 a.m., starting Sunday, November 24th**, and remain so through Easter Sunday, April 20th.



Why are we moving to two services a month earlier than usual? It has to do with the expansion project. Starting November 18th, Viking Construction will be building "false" walls on the interior of the sanctuary, roughly at the inside edge of the soffit. This needs to be done in order to tear down the current exterior walls to make the opening into the new space that's being built around the outside of the current building. This will cause the loss of approximately 30-35 chairs, which means the sanctuary will only be able to hold 100-110 people. It would be difficult to accommodate the numbers we normally have in December with the restricted number of seats. That's why the change to two services, starting on November 24. Please make note of this important change.

You should also know that the worship schedule for Christmas Eve will be expanded to three services this year, at 4:00, 6:00, & 8:00 p.m., for the same reasons. The plan is to make the 4:00 p.m. service one that is family/keiki friendly, while the 6:00 and 8:00 p.m. services will be the more traditional style. 
2014 PLEDGE DRIVE KICK-OFF BREAKFAST

HEALTHY CONGREGATIONS WORKSHOP

On Saturday/Sunday, January 25-26, you are invited to participate in a "Healthy Congregations" workshop here at KLC, which will be led by Pastor Paul Kirchner, from Lihue Lutheran Church on Kaua'i. The workshop will last 3 hours on Saturday morning, and 2 hours on Sunday afternoon. The following is a description of the workshop that Pastor Paul sent:

Rev. Pete Steinke did some ground-breaking work based on the premise that there are parallels between how a person's physical body works, and how the Body of Christ works. It is not a new idea, for even the Apostle Paul wrote, "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body . . ."

As the environment around us changes, (age, diet, work schedules, etc.) they have an impact on our total health. Thus, it is important to periodically take the time for a physical to simply make sure the body is functioning as effectively as possible.

So too, in the church, external changes (staff, grow or lack of growth, building up-keep, offerings, etc.) all have an impact on the "Body of Christ". Thus, it is important to periodically take time for a "Body of Christ" physical.

Similar to our own bodies, what is often perceived as a minor annoyance can be a symptom pointing to a more major concern. Early detection can be critical. So too, the same is true in the "Body of Christ".

Although this event is 2 ½ months away, please mark the dates on your calendar and do everything you can to attend. It's open to all members and friends of KLC, so that we might grow in our grasp of how to live and serve together in a healthy way.


Brighten your dinner table with these festive candle holders.


