





FACILITIES EXPANSION APPROVED

On Sunday, September 23rd, the congregation met and voted to expand the KLC facilities in a single phase. This exciting plan will enlarge the buildings by approximately 3,800 sq. ft., and provide much needed classroom and worship space, at an estimated cost of \$860,000.

Because of the Matching Funds Drive, which was successfully completed in August, \$500,000 of that cost is already in hand. With this fact in mind the congregation also voted to continue the fund raising efforts through a three year capital campaign program, which will formally begin this January, to raise the \$400,000 needed to cover the estimated difference between the cost of the expansion and what the church has in existing funds. They voted as well to begin the process of securing a loan to cover that difference at the time construction is begun.

The Building Team hopes to start construction in the summer of 2013, with completion of the project by Thanksgiving. As funds continue to be received for the building program, all KLC members and friends are encouraged to continue their financial support of these efforts throughout the balance of 2012.











ALOHA FROM PASTOR DAVE

If you read the article on the front page of this newsletter, then you know that at its meeting on September 23rd, the congregation overwhelmingly approved moving forward with plans to expand the facilities at KLC – something we've been considering for the past couple of years. In light of the cost estimate information that was shared by the Building Team, the decision was

made to construct the entire expansion at once, rather than doing so in a couple of phases spread out over a handful of years.

Because of what's been happening at KLC with worship attendance this year, that decision seems to be a wise one. I'm not normally one to spend allot of time looking at statistics. However, this year I haven't been able to ignore what's been going on with our worship attendance numbers. Through the first three quarters of last year the weekly average attendance was 177. At the end of the first three quarters of 2012, that weekly average attendance has shot up to 195. That's nearly 20 more people per Sunday in worship than a year ago, an 11% increase. If this trend continues through the last quarter of the year we will end up with a record high for our average attendance for the year. In 2011 that average was 180, which was an all-time high. Who knows where it will end up this year?

Given those numbers, it makes all the sense in the world for KLC to be expanding the facilities. The construction that the congregation hopes to begin next summer will provide much needed space for both worship, Sunday education, and the numerous different ministries we're involved with. It's not a huge expansion. It's more of a moderate sized one. Yet, it will give us the space we have greatly needed for some time now.

What all of this says is that KLC continues to be a very alive congregation. Much of that comes from the fact that it is such an open and welcoming group of God's people. In the Gospel reading from September 23rd, Jesus talked about that whole matter of being welcoming. When we are that way with all people, we welcome Jesus himself, along with the one who sent him. But with being welcoming also comes the increased numbers at worship that we're experiencing. In turn it also means that the size of the congregation is increasing, which brings with it changes that can be challenging. Those challenges can be experienced in the needs that arise for additional ministries and resources throughout the congregation.

That's why this year's fall stewardship emphasis, which kicks off at the end of October (see the related article on the front page), is so important. More than ever there is a need for all of us to become personally involved in giving back a portion of what God has first given us for use within the ministries of KLC. Yes, I'm talking about our financial gifts. But I'm also wanting to stress the need for us to offer our time and abilities as well. As we take seriously the call to be the Church in this place, let us ask for the Holy Spirit to guide us as to how we will give of ourselves in every way to serving our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

RULE OF 72 AND GIFTING

Ever hear of the rule of 72? How does this tie to gifting? Well, the rule of 72 is an equation to determine how many years it will take for your investment to double at various investment rates. For example, if your investment makes an average of 10% per year, then the number 72 divided by 10 equals 7.2 years to double your money. At 5% per year growth your investment would double in 14.4 years. So if you, for example, give \$10,000 to the KLC Endowment Fund, your gift would actually double in value to \$20,000 in 7.2 years at 10% investment growth. This is a great way do






