

ALOHA FROM PASTOR DAVE



With the coming of December comes the Christmas music that we hear everywhere we go. While there are many Christmas songs that are favorites, one of them that frequently remains on my mind is, "Do You Hear What I Hear?" The last verse of that song begins with the words, "Said the king to the people everywhere, Listen to what I say!"

Recently I received an article from the Alban Institute entitled "Why Listening Matters for Mission and Ministry Today". In the article, the author, Lynne Baab, quotes an unnamed Presbyterian pastor that she interviewed as part of a study on listening in the Church as saying, "We're failing in the wider church to listen to each other well."

Baab then goes on to write, "Much of the emphasis on listening in congregations has focused on pastoral care. Listening as a part of caring ministries matters now as much as ever, because personal needs are as complex, if not more complex, than in years past. Listening skills have also been emphasized for cross-cultural mission. I am convinced, however, that in these rapidly changing times, listening skills are essential for all aspects of congregational ministry and for all kinds of mission."

She also points out that, "...as the West moves deeper into a post-Christendom culture, the people coming into congregations, as well as the people in the wider community, are less likely to be operating from assumptions they share with each other or with the people already attending the congregation. With worldwide migration reshaping our communities and congregations, people in our neighborhoods, workplaces and congregations bring diverse perspectives from their varied cultural and religious backgrounds. In order to understand how to minister in this changing world, my interviewees indicated that we need to know what people value and how they think." The point here is that the way we learn what people value and think is to do more listening, and less talking.

Baab concludes her article by writing, "Listening to God is another aspect of listening that is gaining attention in our time. My interviewees noted that many congregational leaders have become weary of thinking about church as a business. Many are looking for authentic experiences of God's guidance through consensus building and communal discernment, rather than through decision-making models shaped by business or government. Listening is an essential component in both consensus and discernment. And, in fact, becoming a better listener to the people in our lives can help us grow in the ability to listen for God's voice, and growing in listening to God helps us improve our ability to listen to the people in our lives as well."

As we go through the month, moving toward the celebration of the birthday of Jesus Christ, we might do well to be more intentional about our listening. We might be wise to hear those opening words from the last verse of "Do You Hear What I Hear?", which state, "Listen to what I say". For in doing so, we might hear God's voice in the Christ child, calling us to take the time to know what others around us value and think. That's what being the Body of Christ is about. It's why Jesus Christ came to this earth – that we might learn more about who God is in our lives. Mele Kalikimaka! Have a very blessed Christmas!

Adult Bible Study



How often have you said or heard the quote "Hind sight is 20/20"? If only you knew then what you know now, things might have been different. The Israelites didn't have a whole lot of "hind sight" and certainly not one shred of clarity. For us however, the Old Testament is a really good resource for the "Hind Sight" part



of this quote. The New Testament is the 20/20, or the clarity part. As the Kerygma class is traveling through our studies we are realizing this more and more.

Kerygma is the study of the whole Bible in a unique "thematic" approach. While I have pared down the original study to suit our time frame the class has found that there is still an abundance of knowledge to glean from the material as presented. Through the scriptures chosen for each theme we have found that more often than not, these themes and scripture references will also correlate to Dave's weekly sermon.....thus awakening us to realize fully that both the Old and New Testaments are relevant today. In our daily lives the Bible has become alive.

Understanding the reasons for the often tedious passages about battles, exile, seriously flawed kings and repetitive disobedience of the Israelites has opened our minds and hearts to the faithfulness of God's mercy and love for us. Through the failures and disobedience of the earthly kings of Judah and Israel, God is revealing to us through His Word in both the Old and New Testaments the unfolding of His plan for the ages. We can more fully understand the setting for the birth, death and resurrection of Christ. It is exciting to find an "ah ha" moment of clarity in these often tangled stories of deceit, deception and disobedience. In every instance you can see God's hand and merciful love touching every move, word and emotion. He is here today, in all of our lives, moving with precise actions and timing. He is loving us unconditionally with forgiveness, healing and deliverance.

Even though we are half way through the program, it's not too late to join our group. It is not the typical Genesis - Revelation progression. The different Themes are spread throughout the entire Bible. (that was the first "ah-ha") For instance, you will find the theme "God Saves His People" in Exodus, Joshua, and Ezekiel as well as Luke, Acts, and Romans. The program is written so that no matter what level of Bible knowledge you may possess, this class will help you understand and thus use God's incredible Word to complete your daily living. Please join us every Sunday after worship in the Youth Room.

MERRY WISH LIST

For the past 6 months KLC has been blessed by the expansion of our church facilities. While the additional space has been a true gift from God, there are still some parts of the expansion project that haven't been completed, due to the lack of funding. As we approach the end of the year, this "wish list" is being shared, in case someone might be looking for an opportunity to make an end of the year gift to KLC for tax purposes. Please make sure any gift to this "wish list" is over and above your regular offering given to the general operating fund of the congregation, and not in place of it. The day to day ministries of the congregation are also very much in need of everyone's ongoing support. Mahalo nui for any kokua you might be able to offer!

This list is in order of the cost estimate, and not in any order of importance:

- Painting of two (white) stucco wall areas \$725
- Painting of cement block foundation around expansion \$1,175
- Plants for landscaping around the buildings \$2,000
- New Sound Desk for sound system \$2,000
- Gutters for the expanded Sanctuary building \$2,300
- Expansion of the sanctuary sound system \$2,700
- Painting of the handrails \$3,325
- Covering for the new lanai on the mauka side of the sanctuary This yet to be designed structure will require a <u>significant</u> investment, but the additional covering will greatly expand the use of the area. If you would like more information about this particular item, please speak with Pastor Dave.

Please also note that if there is anyone who would like to undertake any of the three painting projects, rather than hiring the work out, that would be welcomed. Again, please speak with Pastor Dave about this.

LOOKING AHEAD

It was with excitement that Kihei Lutheran Church announced the beginning of the new three year Capital Campaign to expand our facilities in March of 2013. We are now more than half way through the campaign and have seen our new church construction completed and dedicated. We are now enjoying the new facilities and the extra space.

But the cost was more than expected (it seems like construction always is more expensive) so we needed to take out a loan from the ELCA's Mission Investment Fund to help pay the extra unexpected costs. Our monthly mortgage payment is \$2,139.00 to MIF to pay off the \$400,000 loan and we even have a wish list of a few items we need to complete the work.

The pledged amount money remaining due for the rest of our 3 year campaign is about \$79,000. The Finance Team is hoping that those who have not completed their pledge (and those who would just like to help give to the campaign fund, but did not pledge) can do so before the end of the campaign. Even a few extra dollars by end of this year will help us pay that mortgage payment every month.

Let's work to pay off this debt so we can concentrate on serving our Lord in the new ways he calls us to do. Mahalo nui for all that everyone has done to help make this project such a success.






MAHALO CONCERT DVD
