Krueger It's interesting how it works. Most of us are usually up for a good story. That story can come in the form of a joke, a good book, an experience that someone has had, a movie that we watch, or even at the start of a STOR sermon. If the story is engaging, we get drawn into it and hang on eve-

ry word. Obviously, Jesus knew that fact, because quite often he would use stories to get across a teaching about who God is and how God relates to us. We often refer to them as parables. Someone once defined a parable as "an earthly story with a heavenly meaning". This Lenten season the mid-week services will center on some of Jesus' more well-known parables, and what they can say to us about what we receive through the crucified Christ. Please join us as we take a look the following parables of Jesus.

Ash Wednesday: "Receive Justification: The Pharisee and the Tax Collector" • Luke 18:9-14. The tax collector who repents goes home justified, while the proud Pharisee does not. We, too, who repent are justified through Christ.

February 25: "Receive the Word: The Sower and the Seed" • Matthew 13:1-8, 18-23. The seed that falls on fertile soil takes root and grows, while seeds in other soils fail. The Word of Christ flourishes within us.

March 4: "Receive the Treasure: The Hidden Treasure and the Priceless Pearl" • Matthew 13:44-46. Two men give all that they have to buy objects of great worth. We who are priceless to Christ receive him who gave all that he had to call us his own.

March 11: "Receive Mercy: The Good Samaritan" • Luke 10:25-37. A man beaten on the road gets help from an unlikely traveler. We who are often beaten down along the road of life encounter the healing of Christ through the cross.

March 18: "Receive Grace: The Workers in the Vineyard" • Matthew 20:1-16. All workers in a vineyard are given the same pay from the master, no matter how long they have labored. All who have been called by the Master are blessed by the same reward in Christ.

March 25: "Receive Forgiveness: The Prodigal Son" • Luke 15:11-32. A wayward son returns to the forgiving embrace of his father, who welcomes him home. We who have strayed return again and again to the embrace of our Father, through the sacrifice of his Son.

Many people don't feel the need of a support group until long after the death of a loved one.

WISH LIST

KLC has been blessed by the expansion of our church facilities for almost a year now. While the additional space has been a true gift from God, there are still some parts of the expansion project that haven't been completed, due to the lack of funding. The following "wish list" is being shared, in case anyone might be looking for an opportunity to give a gift to KLC which would help to complete some of these unfinished projects. Please make sure any gift to this "wish list" is over and above your regular offering given to the general operating fund of the congregation, and not in place of it. The day to day ministries of the congregation are also very much in need of everyone's ongoing support. Mahalo nui for any kokua you might be able to offer!

This list is in order of the cost estimate, and not in any order of importance:

- Painting of cement block foundation around expansion \$1,175
- Plants for landscaping around the buildings \$2,000
- New Sound Desk for sound system \$2,000
- Gutters for the expanded Sanctuary building \$2,300
- Expansion of the sanctuary sound system \$2,700
- Painting of the handrails \$3,325

- Covering for the new lanai on the mauka side of the sanctuary – This yet to be designed structure will require a <u>significant</u> investment, but the additional covering will greatly expand the use of the area. ADULT BIBLE STUDY

Adult Bible Study has been a journey none of us will forget anytime soon. And isn't that the purpose of study?

We began our Kerygma course in January 2014 with the grand intentions of completion in 12 weeks. Well, 40 weeks later we are about 2/3 through it. What was I thinking???

Kerygma is the study of the Bible not book by book, but by themes.

We have learned what exactly the Bible is and how to study it, the pattern of God's saving acts throughout the ages, His promises and covenants in the Old Testament as well as the New. We learned the character of God, and how we get to know an unknowable God. We learned about the Patriarchs, Prophets, Judges and Kings. Currently, we are learning about God's Law and how it demands that God's people and His church be righteous.

As we gear down with the last three themes we will look at how God's people learned wisdom as seen in King Solomon, Ecclesiastes and Proverbs. The New Testament writes of wisdom in a different sense. Paul alludes to Greek philosophy, but emphasizes wisdom that comes from the Holy Spirit.

Theme Eight looks at the different reasons for traditional public worship rites as well as our private worship habits. Theme Nine looks at how God's people are to live in the world. Not just their town or country, but the whole world including other peoples and nature.

Our Tenth and final theme is God's People Have Hope. There is the hope of Israel through the Davidic dynasty, the Apocalyptic Hope of the prophets Ezekiel, Daniel and Zechariah and of course The New Hope in Christ.

Keryx in the Greek New Testament means "herald; one who proclaims news. Kerygma pertains to the message that is proclaimed. We have had many "ah ha" moments when we realize that God's Plan "Really Does Have a Purpose". Or, "THAT's why that happened!", or "I get it now".

"Bible Literacy" was the goal of this study. Have we attained it? Personally, I would say yes. And not just literacy, but, insight and love of Gods WHOLE Word. Where the prophets and judges of the Old Testament were simply stories of a bygone people, now they are real, living breathing people just like me who still has a message to tell through the ages. I can see the continuous weaving of Gods plan in the lives of the Israelites and mine. This insight shows His love for me which allows me to bring His love to others....Go Tell it On the Mountain.

If you haven't been to any of the classes, please don't let that stop you. This is not a program that you have to study prior to class time. Gods Word has kernels of wisdom and direction no matter how you glean it. Please join us on Sunday morning in the new Youth Room (old kitchen) at 9:15 between the early and late services.
