#### **MID-WEEK LENTEN SERIES**

This year's mid-week Lenten series takes place on Wednesdays, with a soup & salad dinner from 6:30-7:30 p.m., followed by worship from 7:30-8:30 p.m. The host congregation will provide soup and bread for the meal, with the visiting congregations being asked to bring salads. These dinners & services will be shared between KLC, Kihei Tongan United Methodist Mission, St. Theresa Catholic Church, and Trinity Episcopal Church by the Sea. This year's series is titled *"The Parables of Lent"*, which will reveal that within each parable's plot a unique message is woven about what we receive through the crucified Christ. Below you will find the schedule for the remaining weeks in Lent. Please speak with Pastor Dave if you have any questions.

**March 4:** <u>at Trinity Episcopal Church by the Sea</u>. "Receive the Treasure: The Hidden Treasure and the Priceless Pearl" • Matthew 13:44-46. Two men give all that they have to buy objects of great worth. We who are priceless to Christ receive him who gave all that he had to call us his own.

**March 11:** <u>at St. Theresa Catholic Church.</u> "Receive Mercy: The Good Samaritan" • Luke 10:25-37. A man beaten on the road gets help from an unlikely traveler. We who are often beaten down along the road of life encounter the healing of Christ through the cross.

**March 18:** <u>at KLC.</u> "Receive Grace: The Workers in the Vineyard" • Matthew 20:1-16. All workers in a vineyard are given the same pay from the master, no matter how long they have labored. All who have been called by the Master are blessed by the same reward in Christ.

**March 25:** <u>at Trinity Episcopal Church by the Sea.</u> "Receive Forgiveness: The Prodigal Son" • Luke 15:11-32. A wayward son returns to the forgiving embrace of his father, who welcomes him home. We who have strayed return again and again to the embrace of our Father, through the sacrifice of his Son



#### **NOISY OFFERING**

Sunday, March 29<sup>th</sup> is the fifth Sunday of the month. It's KLC's practice to receive a "Noisy Offering" whenever there's a fifth Sunday of the month. As part of the Keiki Message on that day, the keiki will go throughout the congregation with tin cans, collecting any loose change that worshipers have with them. In prepara-



tion for that, you are asked to start setting aside all of your change, and then bring it with you to worship that morning. "Silent Money" (checks made out to KLC and paper bills) is also welcome. March's "Noisy Offering" will be given to KLC's Prayer Shawl Ministry. This organization is not supported through the congregation's budget, but solely through donations. To date, over 2,300 shawls have been given to people throughout the world, in all kinds of life situations, reminding them of God's presence with them. # **ALOHA FROM PASTOR DAVE**



During the month of March we move through the season of Lent, journeying toward Holy Week and Easter, which takes place at the beginning of April this year. As has been announced in last month's newsletter, the Sunday bulletin, and again on the front page of this month's newsletter, the focus we have chosen for this Lenten season is centered on the parables that Jesus told in the Gospels. On Ash Wednesday I offered an explanation as to what a parable is. On the surface it may seem like nothing more than a nice story that Jesus is telling. But to those who knew, they were stories that had a deeper meaning which had to do with the Kingdom of God and what it is. The idea behind a parable was to use it as a teaching tool. If you, as the listener, took the time to dig beyond the actually story, you'd find some very important things out about who God is, and who God calls us to be. So often, when we simply receive direct information from someone, the extent of our learning is pretty simple. But if we are encouraged to think for ourselves, and try to arrive at that same information on our own, then that learning tends to stick with us a great deal longer.

That's what parables do, and they're a great lesson for us to learn from when it comes to our growing in knowledge about who Christ is in our life. The temptation as adults is to believe we've learned as much as we can about God during our Sunday School and confirmation years. With that in mind, we feel there's no need for learning anything more about the Christian faith. But how inaccurate that thought is. For if we stop our learning process during our teen years, then we may well end up as an adult with a teenage understanding of God. Yes, we may know the stories and their details, but our grasp and understanding of the Bible will still remain on the level of a teenager. Just like we would never think that learning in general ends in our teen years, so that should be the same with our grasp of the Christian faith, and who God is in our lives. Our growth should continue each and every day.

With that in mind, I'd encourage you to join us each Wednesday during the month of March for our mid-week Lenten services. You'll find the full schedule on the front page of this newsletter. I'd also encourage you to fully participate in Holy Week and Easter worship. No matter how many times we've taken this journey of Lent, Holy Week, and Easter, there will always be something new or different that we can learn – some area of our faith where we can grow. I know that that continues to be the case for me. It can certainly happen for you as well if you give it a try. May God's Holy Spirit guide all of us to an ever-growing sense of who God is in our lives! A blessed Lent, Holy Week, and Easter to each of you!

### HOLY WEEK & EASTER SCHEDULE

Although Holy Week and Easter are a still a month away, because they come right at the beginning of April, it's good to have the schedule of special worship services available in advance. Please make note of this schedule on your calendar now, and make plans to observe these holy and special days of the Christian faith.

**Maundy Thursday – April 2<sup>nd</sup>, 6:00 p.m. –** KLC will join with Trinity Episcopal Church by the Sea for a potluck supper and worship service as we recall how Jesus, the night before his crucifixion, gave us a new command to love one another, and instituted the Lord's Supper. The meal starts at 6:00 p.m., and will be potluck, so you are asked to bring a "covered dish" to share. A part of the mealtime will include some of the ritual actions of a traditional seder supper. The worship service begins at 7:30 p.m., and will include Holy Communion and foot-washing. The meal and the service will be held at Trinity Episcopal Church by the Sea, 100 Kulanihakoi Street in Kihei.

**Good Friday – April 3<sup>rd</sup>, 7:00 p.m. –** We gather in the KLC sanctuary with Trinity Church to remember our Lord's passion and death. Through scripture readings and the extinguishing of candles we relive the events of Christ's arrest, trial, suffering, and crucifixion. The congregation's choir and 4-Given will participate, along with several soloists.

**Easter Sunday – April 5<sup>th</sup>, 8:00 & 10:30 a.m**. – As the words, "He is risen!" echo through our sanctuary, we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ through our worship. Both services will include Holy Communion, Christian Hula, and our congregation's choir.

**Keiki Resurrection Celebration** – Immediately following our 8:00 a.m. service, a Keiki Resurrection Celebration will take place in the Education Room. Please plan to join us and give your keiki an opportunity to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

**Easter Lu'au** – That same day, starting at 12:00 p.m., there will be a congregational lu'au/potluck at church. The Fellowship Team will supply beverages and all paper products. You are asked to bring food to share.



### FIRST COMMUNION CLASS

On Monday, March 16<sup>th</sup>, at 6:30 p.m., Pastor Dave will hold a one hour class for those from KLC who will receive their First Communion on Palm Sunday, March 29<sup>th</sup>. It is the congregation's practice that children who are baptized, and in 4th grade or older, may begin to take communion. This class is intended to prepare those who will do so this year. # **GRIEF SUPPORT GROUP**

A Grief Support Group for adults will begin on March 4, 2015, from 3 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. and every other Wednesday after. The March and April dates are as follows:

March 4 and 18, April 1 and 15 and 30, and continuing thereafter. Hospice Maui Counselors will be facilitating the group.

The group provides and opportunity to share your experiences and feelings regarding the death of your loved one and to listen to and learn from others. Participants share about the death of their loved one, how their grief is progressing, what has worked to help them, what challenges they are facing, etc. We all grieve differently. Many people don't feel the need of a support group until long after the death of a loved one.

Come whenever your are ready, whether it is soon after your loved one's death or much later. Please invite those you know who might benefit from this group. ## ADULT BIBLE STUDY

Adult Bible Discussion began Theme 7 part 1 on February 15. This Theme is in two Parts: both look at how and why "God's People Learn Wisdom" in the Old Testament and the New Testament.

In the ancient world there was widespread interest in what was called "wisdom." This included advice on human conduct, insight into human nature, and literary expressions of good judgment. Solomon became the patron of this kind of wisdom in the biblical tradition. A wisdom "movement" developed late in the prophet-period and was very important after the exile, Job, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Solomon are wisdom books.

Theme 8,"God's People Worship" we expect to start on March 8 and finishing the last part 3 during the first two weeks of April. The history of the Jewish people is inextricably involved with worship. From the Patriarchs through Passover at the exodus to the temple in Jerusalem, worship experience is vital to Jewish identity. Exile and restoration brought changes, but the major festivals marked the cycle of the year and are essential to an understanding of the Bible.

Late April, we will push through Theme 9, "Gods People Live in the World". This looks at how the Old Testament people and prophets viewed their world, from nature affecting their crops and health to the evil powers in the world. God's concern for the whole world is evident from Genesis on. Israel, however, continued to live a self-centered existence. We look at how geography and archeology has given modern day people an insight to the ancient world. The second part shows us how the Holy Spirit affected their (and our) view.

Theme 10 we expect to finish in June. "God's People Have Hope". The Hope of Israel, the Apocalyptic Hope and the New Hope in Christ.....what a wonderful ending.

Please join us in the Youth Room after the first service and before the second service.... 9:15 to 10:15.
