ALOHA FROM PASTOR DAVE



Pr During this past month there have been numerous people asking about what exactly will happen at KLC in terms of a pastor, once I retire on October 1. While Bishop Finck addressed this matter with the church council and the congregation during his June 6-7 visit, I'd like to take a moment to explain it again, for those who were unable to be at those meetings, as well as for those who are not on-island at this time of the year.

Whenever there is a pastoral vacancy, there is normally another pastor who comes and temporarily serves the congregation while they are involved in the search process for a new, permanent pastor. In the past, such persons would lead worship and preach on Sunday mornings, as well as offer pastoral care if there was an emergency. But usually they would do so only on a part-time basis. Often these would be retired pastors who lived in the area of the church.

Over the years, however, that approach has changed. Studies have shown that the best time for a congregation to look at itself and consider what needs to be changed or rearranged happens during a pastoral vacancy. With that in mind, frequently what's referred to as a transitional pastor comes into the vacant congregation. This is a person who has had very specific training in guiding the congregation through the time of transition. This pastor serves in a full-time capacity, not only preaching and leading worship on Sunday, but working alongside all of the different ministries of the congregation, as well as with all of the members, to guide them through a specific process that involves things like: saying good-bye to and letting go of the previous pastor, recalling the congregation's history, carrying out conversations about the strengths and areas of growth that are present in the congregation, addressing any unresolved issues that might be hiding in the shadows of the church, as well as looking to the future and wondering what new ministries and areas of service God might be calling them to. This process is not something that is completed overnight. It can take 1-2 years to go through, so the congregation has to be patient and not rush to get through it. Then, when they call a new permanent pastor and he/she arrives, they will be ready to welcome that pastor with open arms and move forward with their mission and ministry.

This is the direction Bishop Finck has recommended KLC take. When he was here at the beginning of June, he shared with everyone that he had a specific person in mind to be that transitional pastor here. While this person's name has not yet officially been released, it is known that he has substantial intentional ministry experience, and has lived in Hawai'i before, so island life and the culture are no strangers to either he or his wife. It's hoped that his name will be made public to the congregation very soon.

Needless to say, there's much more that goes into the process than I have included here. This has been intended to simply be a quick overview for those of you who are wondering. A Transition Team will be set up to work with the interim pastor, and assist him in guiding KLC through the process. In the meantime, please continue to keep KLC lifted up in your prayers, as well as the transitional interim pastor who will be coming to be with you. I am certain that the same God who has led you to be the shining light of the gospel on Maui that you are today, will be the same God who will help you move forward through this time of transition, to the next level, in terms of serving Jesus Christ in the days ahead. I can promise you that Kathy and I will keep all of you in our prayers every day!

"Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things" (1 Corinthians 13:7). Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of the crucified and risen Christ.

Last week the U.S. Supreme Court rendered its decision announcing the right of same-gender couples to have equal access to marriage. For many members of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, this decision is a welcome sign of hope and a time for celebration. Other members of this church do not agree with the court's decision and remain deeply concerned because of their understanding of Scripture.

This decision affects each of us, some profoundly, and we are not of one mind. Let us continue to accompany one another with prayer, love and mutual respect as we reflect on this new reality and remember Paul's words in 1 Corinthians about the enduring power of God's love. The ELCA social statement "Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust" (2009) neither endorses nor forbids same-gender marriages and recognizes that we have differing understandings and convictions on this matter. In its decision, the court stated that "the First Amendment ensures that religious organizations and persons are given proper protection as they seek to teach the principles that are so fulfilling and so central to their lives and faiths."

According to this church's social statement on human sexuality, all decisions about recognizing, supporting and holding publicly accountable same-gender relationships are entrusted to congregations. Recognizing that the church is not of one mind on this subject, our 2009 actions provide that congregations and clergy should discern together whether to recognize such relationships and to what degree.

Pastors are to engage in conversation, discernment and partnership with the congregations who have called them prior to solemnizing or presiding over a same-gender marriage. On the other hand, no pastor is obligated to solemnize the marriage of any couple, same-gender or different-gender, whom the pastor cannot in good conscience marry.

As Lutheran Christians, we continue to be a church that engages in conversation and discernment in all aspects of our faith and life. Creating space for respectful conversation and dialogue continues to be an important part of our life together. A helpful resource for engaging in difficult conversations is "<u>Talking Together as Christians about Tough Social Issues</u>." In addition, the ELCA Ministry to and with Same-Gender Couples and their Families Working Group remains in the process of completing its work. A report of the group's findings and possible recommendations will be presented to the ELCA Church Council at its November meeting.

We seek to see our differences as a gift to be celebrated as we live out that which unites us: the mercy and grace of Jesus Christ who leads us into mission and ministry in the world. In the midst of this change, we are first and foremost church – a church that proclaims the good news of Jesus Christ. May God bless, guide and strengthen you each day as you go in peace and serve the Lord.
