
PLEDGE DRIVE

Our 2016 Annual Pledge Drive will take place January 10th - 31st 2016.


We will have our 2016 budget by then and will have a goal to meet with our new pledges.

ALOHA FROM PASTOR DAVID



Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ,

Every morning when I rise, I can look out the kitchen window and see the grandeur of Haleakala. I can then look out the back windows and enjoy the splendor of the Pacific Ocean. I marvel at the fact that in the space of just a few miles we can explore the wonders of the universe through powerful telescopes and then discover the bounty that awaits us in the

depths of the ocean. What a fantastic world God has created for us and how blest we are to be able to live in Hawaii and bask in the riches of this place called Paradise. Every day is a feast for the eyes, and it all comes from the gracious hand of God. Sometimes all of this blows my mind and I can't do anything but to worship and to sing a doxology in praise and thanksgiving to God.

How foolish I would be to believe, "I own all of this. It belongs to me, and this is my possession!" What a ridiculous thought! God has entrusted his creation to all of us, and it's a free gift to be enjoyed whether you're rich or poor or whatever your status in life. We in Hawaii, in particular, should realize this fantastic treasure that has been given to us, and, as a result, be wise and responsible in our stewardship so that all peoples, now and in the future, can sit down at the table of life. The stewardship of God's abundant creation has never been more critical than it is today, and we have a role to play.

This is also true in regard to our financial resources. In contrast to the riches of creation, we like to claim ownership of our finances rather than acknowledging that this, too, has been entrusted to us as a gift from the gracious hand of God. Our wealth has been loaned to us for our livelihood but also for the good of our neighbor. Because of God's grace churning through our lives, we realize that all that we have is a gift to be used not only for our benefit but for the welfare of others.

Although an emphasis on the stewardship of our financial gifts won't happen until January, the Gospel reading for the second Sunday in November will challenge us to live faithfully with the wealth that has been granted to us. An impoverished widow gave away two copper coins. She gave away everything she had – indeed, all she had to live on. This poor widow also points forward to the suffering and the death of Jesus who will give it all away – even his life – for the redemption of the world.

An offertory prayer reminds us: Generous God, on the cross Jesus gave everything he had – his whole life for the sake of the world. As we offer this part of all you have given us, form us as generous people who give not only our treasures but also our time, talents, and selves for your sake and your use in the world. This is why we are lavish and gracious with our offerings. Grace beckons us and encourages us to use our resources in mission and ministry for others.

As we are reminded of the miracle of creation, we also have another miracle right before us. That's the miracle of this congregation and our brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. In this place we are blest with the means of grace; we are blest by each other and our compassion and care for one another; and we are blest with the opportunity to serve this community and beyond.

All that we do here isn't possible without your loving support. As we near the end of the year, I hope your giving reflects your response to the overflowing love of God in Jesus Christ who gave away everything for the salvation of the world and for us.

OCTOBER ANGELS



We have recently indicated that our income thus far does not cover our expenses to date. Recently the Finance Committee projected the anticipated shortfall for 2015. As depicted above, we estimate that at the end of the year we may have a shortfall of over \$3,700. While this is not an enormous amount of money, it would have been larger had we not used \$18,764 of carryover funds from last year. It is now difficult to make payroll each month.
