CHRISTIAN UNITY



Moving Forward at KLC



At our January council meeting, the congregation council will be selecting potential candidates for the Transition Team. In this newsletter, a nomination form is included where you can nominate those whom you think would be good people to serve on the Transition Team. You can also nominate yourself.

The work of the Transition Team will include two primary areas. One is self-study. The purpose of self-study is to look at your history, both the highs and the lows, since your organization in 1988. What has shaped you and molded you? What are

the significant events and celebrations that have taken place in your brief history? This can be a delightful time as members, associate members, and winter visitors come together to reminisce about their experiences at KLC – both the joys and the sorrows – and all that has transpired in your life together. Another critical piece of the self-study is the Ministry Site Profile. This Profile provides, as thorough as possible, an accurate picture of the congregation. This gives pastoral candidates more complete knowledge of the congregation as they consider being available to interview and for call.

The second area focuses on the values and mission of the congregation. The congregation needs to discern through the guidance of the Holy Spirit these primary questions: "Who are we as the people of God in this place? Where is God leading us into the future, and how do we move forward toward this vision?" We will attempt to respond to these questions by using surveys, cottage meetings, and additional discussion venues along with prayer, other spiritual disciplines, and worship. What is discovered through this process will also be included in the Ministry Site Profile. In addition, I hope that through our conversations we will be able to clearly define the gifts and abilities needed by the next called pastor to lead and guide you for the next chapter in your corporate life.

As you consider your nomination for this team, please remember:

The duration of the Transition Team could be 4 – 6 months depending how efficiently team members do their work and how frequently they meet.

Even if you won't be at Kihei Lutheran through the entire process, do you have some gifts or expertise that would benefit the work of the Transition Team? If so, please indicate on the Nomination Form and when you will be available.

I realize that all of us aren't at the same stage in the Transition Process. Some are still grieving the loss of Pastor Dave and Kathy and the minor differences that have transpired, which is normal and to be expected in any transition. If you have some concerns about which I can be helpful, I invite and encourage you to visit with me.

All of us need to remember that this time of transition is not an accident. You are not at this cross-roads because of fate or because that's just the way it is in the life of a congregation. You are not a victim. Just as the Holy Spirit has called Pastor Dave to a new chapter in his life, so the Holy Spirit has brought you to this place and uses it as an opportunity to call you to new ventures and to new forms of mission and ministry. This can be an exciting and invigorating time as you play a role in shaping and molding your future – the promised future God is giving to all of us as a gift.

May God smile upon us and look upon us with favor as we discern and work together under the tender care and wisdom of the Holy Spirit.

Reflections on Baptism and the Baptismal Font Location

Martin Luther once wrote: "Remember your baptism. Come daily to the font where you die to sin and walk in newness of life." Lutheran pastor Daniel Erlander also tells us:

We are Christians because God surprised us. Coming in water, God washed us and grafted us into Christ. Our identity for all the days of our life is set. We are children of God...disciples of Christ, a servant people...proclaimers of the wonderful deeds of God. Jesus' story becomes our story. Baptized into his death, we are raised to live as the Body of Christ in the world today.

Because baptism is a sacrament and central to the core of our faith and our Lutheran tradition, the Baptismal font is being moved to the center aisle, near the entrance, to reflect its importance and our theology. If you so desire, when you pass the font, dip your finger into the water, make the sign of the cross upon your forehead, and remember these words: *I am a child of God, sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.* May it be a living reminder that we are baptized into the death of Christ and raised to live as his body wherever and whenever we have the opportunity.

Thank you to all of you who participated. Here we go... I hope I don't forget anyone!


- -**Hula**-for your continued celebration of dance at all services-Sally for creating, "O Holy Night", into dance and all of you again for, "Silent Night".

Now is your chance to get these questions answered.




