

ALOHA FROM PASTOR DAVID

...you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters never fail. Isaiah 58:11b

In the "Invitation to Lent" for Ash Wednesday, we are reminded once again of the nature and purpose of the Lenten Season:

We begin this Holy Season by acknowledging our need for repentance and for God's mercy. We are created to experience joy in communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation. But our sinful rebellion separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, so that we do not enjoy the life our creator intended.

This invitation invites us to confess our sin. It invites us to acknowledge that we have not loved God and our neighbor as God desires. We have not served as Jesus has served us. We are also asked to acknowledge many individual and corporate sins that we have committed against each other, against creation and our environment, as well as our indifference to cruelty and injustice. The repentance that God wants is free of anxiety or selfish concern. True repentance propels us to be concerned about the needs of our neighbor without being concerned with how we're going to benefit.

Throughout the Lenten Season we need to ask? Does our repentance help us to see the people we meet each day as God's beloved children especially the least and the lost? Do our acts of repentance help us to see how our society and creation is broken, which is reflected in the reality of widespread hunger, homelessness, violence, and oppression, and do we engage in ways that bring justice and healing to all people and to the environment?

Does our repentance call us to change both our individual morality and ethics as well as how we act and live together as the body of Christ? Does our contrition embolden us to be more compassionate, more forgiving, and more loving to our brothers and sisters in this community of faith in addition to our witness and service to our neighbor?

Every Ash Wednesday we depart into the world by wearing our faith visibly with the mark of the cross upon our foreheads. Each and every person received this cross as these words were spoken: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." This is a sobering reminder of our mortality, but it's also a blessing. God does have undying love for us and for all of his dust children. Therefore, the ashes of our mortality and our humility are intended to connect us with others and with all of creation with the same love by which Jesus has loved us. If God loves us with such undying love, then we, too, must hold each other and all created things in our hands with the greatest, care reverence, and respect.

My hope for you is that you will immerse yourselves in the gift of the Lenten Season. Be present in our mid-week worship; engage in the additional worship opportunities that will be provided during Holy Week; participate in a meaningful spiritual practice such as prayer and meditation, fasting, or works of love and service.

When we do this we will go forth into our world not only with the sign of repentance upon our fore-heads; this sign of repentance will also be in our hearts. It will be a repentance that enriches the lives of the people we encounter each day, and it will free us to live into grace, which will bring us closer to God and to others.

In so doing, says Isaiah, you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters never fail.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

A WORD FROM OUR PRESIDENT

"Very truly I tell you, whoever accepts anyone I send accepts me; and whoever accepts me accepts the one who sent me." (John 13:20)

"Whoever welcomes you welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me." (Matthew 10:40)

The first quote above may be appropriate as we near Lent. It is from the last supper just after Jesus exposes Judas for betrayal. A similar quote comes from Matthew as Jesus sends his disciples out into the world. While very different, they convey a similar message of welcome. Welcome Christ's disciples; welcome others; that is what Jesus modeled throughout His life on earth. It is something we are called to do – to be sent into the world and to welcome others.

During our last council meeting and during our meeting with committee chairs the week before, I posed three questions. The questions were created by experts in planning to help illuminate where we are as a congregation and to help us discern where the spirit may be leading. The questions paraphrased: what excites you most, where do you see energy within the congregation and where are we spending most of our time. Two particular responses really caught my attention. The first came from the committee chairs and the very real excitement around our Community Assistance Committee. They are helping us to do God's work in helping the less fortunate at all levels, and their activity grows seemingly each month. The second, was at council, where I was reminded of what a welcoming congregation we are. I echo that observation. I visited my son's church while on Michigan last week, and while most folks I met extended a hand to shake and said welcome, it wasn't the warm aloha of KLC. Thank you for demonstrating Christ's love.

Also at Council Pastor shared an article, *A New Kind of Pastor*, from this month's *Living Lutheran*, the monthly magazine of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The article shares a change in approach to "church" in how pastors are prepared. Briefly, it notes that the church hasn't done the best job at reaching out, rather it has focused on "serving" its members. Further, it notes that congregants typically assign the recruitment of new members to the pastor. It recognizes that both of these concepts miss the mark. In Christ we are called out into the world to spread the good news. The seminaries are now trying to equip pastors for greater service to the world. This change is a good thing; it may be what God is trying to tell us as the number of "believers" continues to shrink. This article really touches on the key to who we are as KLC. We have the gifts to deliver, with the help of the Holy Spirit, on God's call to each and everyone one of us.

We have a tradition in this congregation called the "three minute rule." Dating back more than 15 yeas this is a reminder to find someone new each Sunday and speak with them for three minutes. Introduce yourself; get to know who they are. As the *Living Lutheran* suggests, this is a shared responsibility, lets continue to show the aloha spirit each week. Hale Kau Kau, a community outreach program of St.Theresa Church in Kihei is holding their annual fundraiser dinner at the Kea Lani Hotel on Sunday, March 26 from 3 to 8PM.

There will be live and silent auctions with over 300 items. Dinner is at 5:30. Tickets are \$140 each. The Readers and the Embrys each have a table of 10 and would love for you to join them.

Hale Kau Kau serves about 180 meals daily to both the homeless and homebound, nearly 5000 meals a month. It takes \$350,000 a year to run the program so your generous support is needed. Many at KLC have served as drivers for meal delivery, worked in the kitchen or as servers... examples being Walt Grotz, Dave and Sam Mather and Dave Reader.


name and phone number of the person you should contact either to volunteer or with questions. This information is also in the white notebook on the usher's table. including extra copies in each sleeve for you to take.






