


PASTOR JOEL T. MARTYN ACCEPTS CALL!

A WORD FROM OUR PRESIDENT

"The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it. (Genesis 2:15)

And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work. (2 Corinthians 9:8)

These two passages discuss God's blessing and our stewarding of that blessing. God has created us, in fact created everything. God then entrusted us with this good creation. God also formed the church to act on His behalf, both as community and as individuals. He also created our congregation at this location to serve others and to support one another. To aid us God provided the gifts: time, talents and finances, and trusted us to use these gifts wisely. In return we are a giving and active congregation. So where am I headed?

This is a call for participation in a congregational meeting to consider expanding our loan with the Mission Investment Fund (MIF). The MIF is an ELCA organization that among other things advances the ministry of our church, because the money earned through our loan is used to fund building and renovation loans for ELCA congregations and ministries.

To summarize our situation, we currently have an MIF 25-year, loan with a balance of \$376,000 and an interest rate of 4.25%. MIF loan interest rates are recalculated every five years. So our current loan interest will be recalculated next fall (2018) and we expect the rate to increase at that time. The MIF has approved a \$500,000 loan which consolidates our existing remaining balance and adds \$124,000 for our use. The interest rate for the loan will drop to 3.875%. Also, that will delay any recalculation of our interest to the year 2022, guaranteeing the reduced 3.875% rate until that time. The cost for our monthly mortgage would increase from \$2,139 to \$2,605 (\$466 dollars per month). In addition, there will be a fee of \$4,725 to begin the new loan.

How will the money be used? To address infrastructure needs that have been accumulating since we moved into our buildings. We have not, over the years, provided adequate funding to maintain the existing properties or necessarily keep up with our growing ministry. Some items being considered include: painting the exterior of our buildings; resurfacing the parking lot; completion of the office wing renovation; replacing the sliding doors into the worship space; updating the kitchen area or purchasing the parsonage solar panels to eliminate a costly lease.

So where do I stand? Smack in the middle. I have been raised that being in debt is not a good thing. On the other-hand what we are being offered is money that can be used to "catch-up "on our stewardship responsibilities for our facilities at a low rate. One question, is where we should invest, in the infrastructure to support our ministries, or more directly into those ministry areas? Please join us on Sunday July 9 after worship and help us decide.

Zel is always busy with something either during the service on Sundays or during the week, we appreciate all he does. Last week Keli repaired the Holy Water stand as it got moved and broken, so much is done, it's hard to say thanks for all everyone does but we want you to know you are all appreciated.

A blast from the past.....






