



ALOHA FROM PASTOR JOEL



The word 'incarnation' comes from a Latin word that that literally means "in the flesh", which is the reference for the act of God to take on human flesh and enter our world ROMTHE to bring about reconciliation between Godself and humanity in the form and person of Jesus the Christ. Jesus came to live among us, to teach us about love, grace, mercy, kindness and justice. "The Word became flesh and lived among us." John 1:14

The incarnation not only qualifies God's acts in this world but must also qualify our acts as well. Think about it. If God's way to reach the world was to dwell among us (Incarnational) our ways of reaching the community around us should be the same. It is important that we make a distinction between the Incarnation (Capital I) and being incarnational (little i). The Incarnation of Jesus Christ is its own thing, important and one of the tenets of our faith. Being intentional and practicing an incarnational ministry is another thing. It is a way of living as Jesus lived, teaching the way Jesus taught, and loving as Jesus loved. Being out among the people.

In 1 Peter 2:21 Peter tells us clearly that Jesus' life is to be our example in how we live our own lives.

"To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you should follow in His steps."

Peter makes it clear that Jesus' life is to be our example and we are to imitate it.

I feel that it is very important to not wait for people to come to us so that we can serve them, but that we go to them, wherever they are, be it the beaches here on Maui, the clubs, the grocery stores, workplaces, jungle trails, tourist traps etc. etc. etc. Incarnational Ministry is a ministry which becomes a part of our daily living. It becomes a part of who we are as disciples of Jesus. Matthew 28 comes to mind:

"19 Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Jesus' command to "Go" is just that, a command to go. Get out there. Get to know people. Serve others, love others, minister to others. The word "Go" carries with it a connotation that one should leave the place where they are at. Meet people where they are.

Aloha KLC Ohana,

This month, the Executive Committee met with our Hukilau Conference Dean, Rev. Kathryn Zurcher. You may remember her as one of our guest preachers in between Pastor Barber's departure and Pastor Joel's installation. (The Hukilau Conference is the group of churches in Hawaii affiliated with the ELCA). As part of her duties as Dean, Rev. Kathryn has been traveling to each of the Hukilau Conference churches and visiting/checking-in with the leadership teams. Our time with her was enriching as we discussed efforts of the Hukilau Conference to keep our ELCA churches across the state more connected. Speaking of the Executive Committee, some feedback/questions have come to the attention of the Congregational Council, and I wanted to clarify the decision-making process of Council. As per the KLC constitution, the Executive Committee is made up of the Pastor, Council President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. This team has the following three main purposes: 1 - Set the draft agenda for the Congregational Council meeting each month; 2 - In case of an emergency only and if the full council cannot meet, make decisions on behalf of the congregation; 3 - Sign documents, contracts, checks, etc., approved by our KLC internal policies. Our constitution is clear, the committees do the work and make most decisions. Our Congregational Council is primarily an oversight team with fiduciary/financial responsibilities. Committee efforts to meet, do the work of our church and report back to council is going fairly well.

To help our committees coordinate and communicate, we are asking that Committee Chairpersons (or a representative) attend a potluck meeting on Tuesday, October 15, at 6pm. Council members will also attend.

One of the other items that has come to our attention is that some in our congregation do not feel information or decisions are being communicated. I would kindly ask that all members and friends please carefully read all of the KLC publications. The Council and the KLC Committees honestly try really hard to communicate information via the monthly newsletter, weekly E-blasts and the Sunday bulletin. I encourage all in our ohana to read and fully digest these publications. If you have questions, please reach out to the respective committee chair or a council member. You could even call or email the office and Cate can direct you to the correct person to answer you question. Or go to the online question box. If you are not receiving these important communications please contact the church office. All members should do their part to stay informed.

In the Executive Committee meeting with Rev. Kathryn, she asked in closing, "What are you excited or most pleased about here at KLC?". And while we discussed many of our successes, a common theme was the quality of our worship on Sunday mornings. We should all feel blessed to be a part of this beautiful church. I know I do!

SEPTEMBER SECRETARY'S REPORT

Council Meeting of September 17th

Council met at the church on September 17 with a quorum present. Pastor Joel started the meeting with a devotion and prayer, and the usual business of approving the agenda and the previous month minutes were completed.

Something new has been added to the meetings and the minutes. We now acknowledge action items throughout the meeting that need to be addressed and someone on Council volunteers to be sure that item is completed prior to the next meeting. At the following meeting those action items are reviewed to be sure they have been taken care of. These are all directly related to items on the agenda.

Pastor and President reports are always submitted in writing and are available by contacting the office or Marilyn Hopkins. The Treasurer reported that there is \$8,600 in the general fund, without having to borrow from any reserve funds. Council authorized for \$1,400 to be added to the Keiki Klothing Exchange account from the designated KKE account.

Cate and Sue are gathering information requested for the audit. The church directory is close to completion. Since it will be a digital directory with people having the ability to update their own information, Cate will be provide a link to Council members first to test its use.

Little Hoku Montessori School continues to be a positive addition to property usage. The Neighborhood Power PV System program and the sewer manhole project were updated and information is provided elsewhere in this newsletter. Council accepted the task force recommendation not to accept the lease with Neighborhood Power

Committee liaisons, chairs and members were reported and accepted by Council as required by our constitution. The committees, their chairs and Council liaisons are listed here. If you have any interest in any of theses committees, please contact the chair or liaison. We would love to have you join the process of discussion and decision- making.




