ALOHA FROM PASTOR JOEL

November is here and Thanksgiving is right around the corner. As Thanksgiving Day approaches, pastors everywhere write corny, predictable newsletter articles or devotionals about how we should be thankful and count our blessings. They will prattle on about how crucial it is for us to focus on the riches we have in Christ. They will stress the importance of discerning between the things we want and the things we need.

This article will be no exception. During this time of year, as we enter the holiday season, we tend to be a little more thoughtful and a little more generous. Certainly, this is admirable. But what if the spirit of thanksgiving inspired us to do more? What if our thankful hearts prompted us to action? What if being thankful propelled us to do something beyond our comfort zones? After all, being thankful may lead us on a journey of sorts.

For some of us, our journey to thankfulness is rather brief. It goes something like this: Dear God, I am so thankful that I have so many blessings (read luxuries). God, you really have been good to me! Amen. While on the surface it is great to give God thanks, our thankful hearts should at least spark a curiosity that inspires us to ask questions. What if our journeys of thankfulness led us to questions like, why do we have so much while other countries have so little? What if our journeys of thankfulness led us to a quest for justice? What if, in addition to being thankful, we could be thankful advocates? What if our thankful hearts extended beyond the turkey and the trimmings, even beyond the Christmas decorations and gifts. What if our thankfulness connected us to our baptismal identity? During the baptismal rite, we enter a covenant with God to proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace. We are sealed in that covenant by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever. Our faith is not passive, private, or privileged. But rather, our faith is proactive, public, and powerful!

The ELCA is a church that rolls up our sleeves and gets to work. We stand up for policies that create opportunities to overcome poverty, promote peace and dignity, and defend God's creation. As members of the ELCA, we believe that we are freed in Christ to serve and love our neighbor. God uses our hands, through our direct service work and our voices, through our advocacy efforts, to restore and reconcile our world. Through faithful advocacy, the ELCA lives out our Lutheran belief that governments can help advance the common good. When we act as a coordinated network of advocates and reach out to officials on relevant, timely issues, we effectively impact public policies. Together, we achieve things on a scale and scope that we could never do otherwise. ELCA advocacy works for change in public policy through political channels on behalf of the following biblical values: peacemaking, hospitality to strangers, care for creation, and concern for people living in poverty and struggling with hunger and disease.

So this holiday season, as we gorge ourselves at family feasts, and as we begin the rapid descent into consumerism, may we embrace the luxury that we most often forget – the luxury we have to affect change, to walk in justice, to give generously and joyfully to our congregation and to help so many here on this beautiful Island. And let us join our voices with the Psalmist, *Let us enter the gates of the Lord with thanksgiving, and the courts with praise. Give thanks and bless God's holy name. For the LORD is good; God's steadfast love endures forever.* That, my friends, would truly be a Happy Thanksgiving.

The regular meeting of the KLC Council was held on October 15th, following a delicious dinner gathering held with Committee Leaders and Council members. Good fellowship and food was had by all as we disucssed team initiatives, council laiasons and concerns.

Marilyn Fornwall offered devotion while Phil opened the meeting with prayer. The agenda and last month's minutes were approved. Because Pastor Joel had been sick there was no Pastor Report although the President's and Administrative Assistant's reports were submitted in writing. There is a balance of \$6,358.00 in the general fund as of October 15, 2019.

NEW BUSINESS

The council conducted an initial review of the proposed 2020 budget and approved that committees can conduct fundraisers, with prior council approval.

Discussion was held on the use of Ray Benson Funds and a motion was approved to create a Ray Benson Task Force with the purpose of developing a plan to spend the funds.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:20 pm with prayer by Mo Hottendorf. The next regularly scheduled Council Meeting will be held on November 19, 2019 at 7:00 pm.
