ALOHA FROM PASTOR JOEL



Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. --1 Corinthians 10:4-7

It's February, the month of Valentines and heart-shaped boxes of candy...so what else is a pastor to write about in the newsletter but love? Thanks to the mass commercialization of Valentine's Day, love is everywhere. Love is all around us!

Is it really, though? I mean, sure, our culture is highly proficient in and dedicated to promoting romance. I've lost count of the number of jewelry commercials on TV today, and I tip my cap to the advertising folks.

But while romance is as abundant as ever, it seems that love is a different story at the moment. It seems that love is harder to come by in the public sphere. Violence always leads off the news broadcasts. And public discourse has become hostile to the extent that political differences have even driven wedges between close friends.

But as people united in Christ, we are called by God to love others even if it's not the most popular thing to do. Fortunately, the Bible is a great resource to help us do this! One of the best descriptions of love in the Bible is the passage I quoted above, written by the Apostle Paul in his first letter to the Corinthian church. These words to the Corinthians are some of the most enduring words in the Bible, and are familiar to many people because they are often read at weddings.

Despite that common use, though, the implications of the kind of love described in 1 Corinthians 13 are wide-ranging. Loving with this sort of patience and gentleness invites others into our lives, providing fertile ground for relationships to grow. Strangers we may at first lump into a category become individual people we truly see, know, and appreciate. Love like Paul describes is able to topple the walls of fear and discord that seem to be so effectively separating people right now.

This is the kind of love God calls us to offer to the world this February. Let this love be our Valentine to everyone, showing the love God has for us in Jesus Christ by offering that same love to others.

The written reports allow you, our members, the time to read and digest ahead of time and be prepared to ask questions, get clarification, etc. on the written reports.

In addition to receiving updates from the committees and teams in this meeting, the congregation will be electing members to the following tasks: Nominating Committee (to procure members to replace outgoing council members); Synod representatives (to represent KLC at the 2020 Synod Assembly); and making a decision regarding the renewal of the lease for the Little Hoku Montessori School. LITTLE HOKU MONTESSORI FACT SHEET

Below are a few points to address questions that have come up recently regarding Little Hoku Montessori School (LHMS). These are presented here in an effort to provide factual information to our congregation so that members can make an informed decision at the February 9th congregational meeting.

The current lease ends at the end of May 2020.

LHMS has met its enrollment goals/capacity and would like to negotiate extending a lease for the next school year.

The school currently pays \$1800 a month in rent (on time). The income has been helpful to the KLC budget.

The school reimburses the church for all water and electric charges beyond the normal use of KLC.

LHMS pays for its own rubbish removal.

Room use questions/issues:

Currently the school leases the primary multipurpose room, the old library and one side of the sanctuary Monday-Friday 7:30-5:30pm.

LHMS pays to have these rooms cleaned more frequently than KLC did before the lease. KLC has access to these rooms outside of the leased hours. LHMS will move their furniture and

equipment if given advanced notice.

LHMS employees and families do not drive or park on the grass.

In general, LHMS has been an excellent tenant. The congregation will vote on February 9th on whether or not to extend the lease. If the congregation votes to extend the lease, the Executive Committee would negotiate terms with a likely increase in rent.

JANUARY SECRETARY REPORT



Council Meeting of January 21, 2019

The regular meeting of the KLC Council was called to order with prayer by President Phil Proctor. There was a quorum present. Jack Jorden gave the devotion.

President and Pastor Reports were received. Pastor Joel visited 14 members and 10 nonmembers, did 1 baptism and performed 2 weddings.

Vicki reported that as of the end of 2019, there was about \$4,800 in the general fund. She will have the financial statements available starting Sunday, January 26. Vicki gave her resignation as Treasurer which was accepted with regret and thanks from Council and the congregation. She and Don will be greatly missed.

Shadi Askarian would like to negotiate an agreement to extend the lease for the Little Hoku Montessori School. This request will be presented at the annual meeting.

With help from Engineering Dynamics, we are moving closer to fulfilling the County requirement for a sewer access manhole. Council accepted the bid from B. Ibara Heavy Equipment to do this work. Funds will come from the MIF loan.

Mo has been researching whether or not KLC needs to have a licensed nursery worker on Sundays. She will get a statement in writing to address this issue.

Mo contacted Matson on behalf of Keiki Klothing Exchange regarding their possible donation of a container to use for storage. Matson provided an agreement to donate a 20- or 40-foot container when one is available.

Proposals were accepted from Noa's Yard Service for full tree trimming in the parking lot and at the back of the church. These costs will be paid from the MIF loan with additional funds, if needed, from church reserves.

The whale watch is quickly approaching, and everyone is encouraged to go and have fun with our KLC friends. Any profit will go to the Fellowship Restricted Fund.

The next regular meeting will be February 18, 2020. Pastor Joel closed the meeting with prayer.




