ALOHA FROM PASTOR JOEL

Aloha KLC. As we move forward into the Thanksgiving, Advent and Christmas seasons, I recognize that not long after that is the new year. 2020... The question on my mind and heart is where we are going and how are we moving forward? I have many plans for 2020 for this church. Perhaps this tale of two churches that I found in a resource called "Sharing the Ministry", might give you some insight into what I am thinking.

The Congregation of the Twisted Arms

"Lots of committee members are missing meetings, and we don't have enough church Sunday school teachers to cover all our classes," the pastor laments. Others at the church council meeting stir uneasily in their seats as he talks. Their down cast eyes are focused on each other's shoes. Some feel guilty, others frustrated. Most are tired of hearing the same old story.

Here at Church of the Twisted Arms, people often speak about the importance of "time, talent and treasure: during the stewardship campaign each fall. They generate a bright new time and talent form every year. Quite a few people sign up. Few are ever called. Some members no longer bother to return their forms. They say they are tired of offering to help and then never being contacted.

The Nominating Committee is frustrated too. It has met for two months, gone through the church directory, and made frantic calls to members to try to get them to serve in important leadership positions. The calls are hard to make and the results are frustrating. Many people say they are too busy. Some suggest it is someone else's turn. The closer it gets to selection time, the more desperate the Nominating Committee gets.

There are problems and complaints in the Christian education program too. Parents are complaining that some of the teachers don't seem able to relate to youngsters and that most of the teachers require the children to recite answers from memory.

The pastor got a call from a hospitalized parishioner who told him never to send "that volunteer visitor" again. The visitor had upset her.

Members of the Church Council are beginning to wonder whether the fact that so many women work outside of the home is hurting recruitment. Others blame competition from school programs and civic groups. Everyone complains, but no one knows what to do.

One thing is certain—it is time to develop another time and talent form for Stewardship Sunday. So the committee assigns Olldren and Sven to put it together. They are instructed to "really tell church members that everyone should help out and do his or her share."

The council meeting ends at 10:30pm Everyone is tired. In the parking lot, Olldren says to Sven, "Don't you think there must be a better way?"

New Vision Church

Sunday is New Vision Church's annual meeting. The list of people who have been invited to serve in church leadership positions has been posted in the church all month. Nominees' pictures appeared in the church bulletin last week. Word is out that the nominating committee has tried something new this year—a letter of call—and people seemed excited to about serving.

Two months ago, New Vision Church concluded a series of adult classes to help people discover their gifts. The class was small but the group was very enthusiastic. They have been telling everyone in the church about the thinks they have been learning.

Several small faith—sharing groups have formed in the congregation in the last year. During the next several weeks, the groups are planning to focus much of their study of Scripture, prayer, and sharing around the discovery and stewardship of their gifts.

The stewardship campaign doesn't include a time and talent sheet this year. Instead, stories about the experiences of volunteer ministers have been printed in the church newsletter, and a discovery-of-gifts form has been circulated on which members may indicate their gifts and areas of personal interest and experience.

The actual volunteer ministry recruitment sign-up was done in January. Position descriptions were included so people knew what they were committing themselves to. Some people didn't sign up because they still doubted that they would be called. (Church leaders knew it would take a while to rebuild the credibility of the recruitment process.)

Everyone who did volunteer received a thank you letter within ten days and a telephone call soon after that. A new shared ministry task force took care of acknowledgements and arranged a follow-up process with the program leaders.

There seems to be a new spirit among members of New Vision Church. When people say no to an invitation, no one chastises them. They are simply encouraged to keep their eyes open for a ministry that better fits their schedule or interests. Leaders no divide positions into more manageable tasks that take less time. There are lots of three-to four-hour tasks. New members are encouraged to take on at least one ministry opportunity during their first six months of membership.

During National Volunteer Week in April, the worship services will include a celebration of Shared Ministry, and a reception will be held to honor ministers. In addition, a group is already planning leadership training for the next year.

There aren't many complaints about apathy now at New Vision Church, and no one is twisting arms to find Christian Education teachers or committee members. The atmosphere is more relaxed. It's exciting to be in a church that values people and gives them a lot of nurturing and understanding. It seems that everyone is trying to find at least one niche in which to serve.

One New Vision member was recently overheard exclaiming, "You know, for the t=first time, I realize that every aspect of my life is ministry."

I am excited to see what happens over the Thanksgiving, Advent and Christmas holidays and into 2020. In the spirit of Thanksgiving I want to give thanks for Cate and Beth, and for our highly dedicated leaders on council who continually try to do their best. And I especially give thanks to God for each and every one of you who make Kihei Lutheran what is right now. You have enriched my life and many different ways, and I am so grateful for you.

DECEMBER SECRETARY REPORT

Council Meeting of December 17, 2019

The regular meeting of the KLC Council was called to order at 7:00 p.m. with a quorum present. The meeting was opened with devotion by Marilyn Hopkins and prayer by Phil. The agenda and minutes of past meetings were approved

Pastor Joel presented some preliminary thoughts on a year-round stewardship program that would utilize a variety of ways of communication; present different ways to get to know KLC, its members and programs; and be provided to all those who attend, visit and support this church.

Treasurer's Report: As of the end of November there was \$2,194 in the general fund.

The Ray Benson Fund task force met with 8 members. The following possible uses of the money were discussed: (1) Pay down the mortgage, (2) youth activities, (3) evangelism, (4) put in reserves. The team will meet in January and then report to Council with their preferred option(s).

Christmas gifts have been given from KLC to Sue, our bookkeeper, and Lucinda, our nursery attendant.

The December 29, 2019, Noisy Offering will go to Kihei Youth Center, with the money collected being used to purchase as many items as possible on their needs list, including recreational equipment, kitchen supplies, snacks and paper products.

The annual meeting to present the annual report will be held on February 9, 2020. Committee chairs are reminded to write a report of what happened in their committee in 2019 to be included in this report.

Council was sorry to receive the resignation of Jadey Sim. After the first of the year, it will again be time to think of people to ask to serve on Council. Please give this prayerful consideration.

The next regular meeting will be January 21, 2020. Keli closed the meeting with prayer.
