CONGRATULATIONS PASTOR BARBER WORD AND SACRAMENT MINISTRY-2021

The Rev. David J. Barber was ordained on June 20, 1971 at Hope Lutheran Church (TALC) in Ladyship Wisconsin by the Reverend William Hood, Pastor of Hope Lutheran Church. Pastor Barber served his first call as Pastor/Worker Priest at Faith Lutheran Church in Lander, Wyoming until 1980. From 1980 -1997 he was called as Associate and then Senior Pastor at Zion Lutheran in Loveland, Colorado. Next. he served as Interim Pastor at Spirit of Joy and then Our Saviour's Lutheran Churches, both in Fort Collins, Colorado. In 2000 he served as Interim and then Called Pastor to Lutheran Church of Honolulu (2000 2006) and then as Interim and Called Pastor at Lutheran Church of the Holy Trinity in Kailua-Kona, Hawaii from 2007 – 2011. He served as Interim Pastor at Bethel Lutheran in Windsor Colorado in 2015. He was called back to Hawaii by the end of that year to serve as Interim Pastor at Kihei Lutheran until 2017. From 2018 – 2020 he served as Interim Pastor at Calvary by the Sea in Honolulu. Pastor Barber has served in a variety of leadership positions on many church boards and community organizations. His skill at leading and coaching congregations to define and actualize their purpose and mission especially in

times of transition and conflict has been key to his success as an Interim Pastor. Throughout his ministry and personal living, God's life-giving sustenance of grace, forgiveness, justice and mercy for all peoples and creation has been the core and focus of his preaching and teaching, continuing education and travel. Pastor Barber is filled with immense gratitude and deeply honored by all the many people and ministry opportunities that have crossed his path and he hopes to have made a difference in the lives of the people and the congregations he has served.

Aloha my friends,

And none of them are alone. All work together for the glory of God, to the best of their abilities and gifts.

My friends in order for us to move forward in ministry as a community of Christ everyone needs to participate. It's very easy to get comfortable in our church life while we trust others to run everything, but those others" who have been doing so much for the life of this church will get tired and burn out and maybe even leave. I'm not saying that this will happen, and I admit that it is one of my fears, but I am saying that it could happen, and I know because I have seen it too many times in other churches.

If any of these positions resonate with you, after you pray about it, please let me or the church office or anyone who is currently on the council know. If you are willing to serve on the council please let the nominating team, myself or the church office know so that we can answer all of your questions and fully inform you of the duties and responsibilities. We have all been called to minister to the world. What role are being called upon to fulfill in the life and ministry of KLC?

REPORT OF THE APRIL COUNCIL MEETING

A regular meeting of the KLC Council was held virtually via Zoom with a quorum present. Janet Harp lead the group in a devotion titled, "I'm Happy for You. Not"

Pastor Joel reported that over the past month he presided over the memorial service for Cathy Trott, provided one private baptism, held Holy Week and Easter services, participated in two online clergy gatherings, taught an online class called 'Making Sense of the Cross', worked on creating a new church structure to reduce pressure on volunteers, and worked with the Worship Team to decide on allowing singing and responsive litanies at worship again. Additionally, Pastor made phone calls to 20 members and 12 non-members in the last month.

Margie reported that KLC received \$4,185 in offerings in the previous week. The general account balance is \$31,605. The Financial Committee is still awaiting the go ahead to submit the PPP loan forgiveness application.

Renee briefed the Council on her activities during the previous month. Holy Week and Easter were busy. Renee worked with the Mutual Ministry Committee to contact congregants to get feedback on our KLC ministry, attended an ELCA stewardship workshop, and attended the Finance Committee meeting. Renee also finalized the contract with Little Hoku Preschool.

Sue reported that Dewey Irrigation came to the property last month to repair a leak in the system.

The Council agreed with the recommendations of the Finance Committee to carefully watch our spending and cut back when able. It was also decided that the Choir Director's salary would be suspended during this fiscally difficult time, with the understanding that it would be reinstated when choir started again. A 'Wish Board' will be created, which will be a way for members and visitors to donate money toward a specific church need, such as office supplies or utility bills.

The Council's Executive Committee was given authority to approve the writing of grants for church purposes.

KLC's video surveillance system will get a new video recorder.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:21pm, and closed with prayer by Pastor Joel. The next regular virtual meeting will be May 18th at 7:00pm.



WAYS TO GIVE

This has been an unusual year in many ways. Although we are worshiping inside and outside the church building, we are still unable to spend time with all of you. Through it all, our work as a church continues. Our staff still works, in fact even more hours, to record worship services and handle daily needs. We "visit" our ohana through phone calls and in other creative ways, help with

needs, collect and deliver food, and all the other things it takes to support the congregation and the community.

Without our regular visitors, with some members choosing to move closer to mainland family, and with job loss on the island as across the country, we are now at a point where the gifts coming to KLC are smaller than the expenses we still have to pay. We have gone through the budget to lower or eliminate as many expenses as possible, many resulting from KLC and other groups not being fully open at this time. We received a Payroll Protection Program (PPP) loan from the federal government to cover payroll for a while, but those funds have been used. We now must rely on contributions, which have begun to lag behind expenses.

We are asking for your help if you are able to do so. Please consider making a donation to the continuing life of KLC. Any amount will help. Small contributions blend together to become large blessings. You can give through the church website, www.kiheilutheran.org by clicking on the "Give" button at the top right of the home page. Or you can download the "Givelify" app to your iphone or Android, then search for Kihei Lutheran Church. Both are completely safe and easy to use. Of course, checks in the mail work too.

We look forward to the time when we can all be together again sharing worship and friendship. Until then, our prayers are with all of you. Take care, stay well, and know that you are loved.


