Ephesians 3:16-21 (NRSV)

¹⁶ I pray that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant that you may be strengthened in your inner being with power through his Spirit, ¹⁷ and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love. ¹⁸ I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, 19 and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

²⁰ Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine. ²¹ to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen.

While we may face challenges from this world we live in, there is something that will keep us through the storms and trials of life, and it is the unending, unfathomable, unexplainable love that God has for each and every one of us, and yes, even for this World.

THANK YOU, Pastor Joel, Cate and Beth

Since the pandemic started and changes were necessary in all areas of KLC, our staff has been doing a lot of extra work. Every week we see the results of just a portion of this work. Sunday worship happens because of what they do.

The pandemic brought new challenges. New technology was found and learned. New ways of communication were devised. There were more church meetings, not less. Pastor Joel, Cate and Beth attended most of them through Zoom. Beth

assumed leadership of the Worship Committee. Innovative and creative ways were found to handle what might have been, or still seem to us, mundane works for service and caregiving. Sundays brought different challenges and more time required.

The church facility was opened safely for face-to-face worship with all safety protocols followed. This is because of staff and Worship Committee decisions.

We come in to a bright and cooled sanctuary. Beth does that.

Cate and Beth work with others to put the chairs in place, with social distancing.

We find the altar set up and beautiful. It is often moved with Pastor Joel on one end and Beth or Cate on the other.

We find a camera set up, ready to record. Pastor Joel does that.

We hear because of the sound system that Beth and Pastor Joel help set up.

Sometime Sunday afternoon we get a link to the Sunday sermon. After worship Pastor Joel stays to edit the recording and put it on YouTube, then sends the link to everyone and puts it on Facebook.

Add to this Pastor Joel spending time reading and studying to prepare inspirational services and sermons, planning in all areas of KLC life, and continuing to make a variety of contacts with our KLC ohana and others in the community. He contacts and prays for the sick and injured and provides guidance in a variety of ways. Cate puts together bulletins, newsletters, eblasts and a variety of other communications. She makes and takes phone calls and knows all about everything KLC to answer all questions. Plus, she does a wide variety of things to keep the church facilities running smoothly, not just within the office, but fixing things around the church building and grounds. Sometimes this involves getting the hammer and screw-driver she keeps in her drawer to actually fix rather than just call the many contractors and vendors she keeps track of. Beth plans liturgies with Pastor. She also plans music and prepares the music and recordings for the cantor/assisting ministers each Sunday as well as planning seasonal liturgies. She looks for ways to feature additional artistic strengths from our congregants. Working with the environmental committee, Beth creates seasonally beautiful worship space aligning with the liturgical seasons.

There is much more, but you get the idea. We have a lot to thank these three great staff members for. Be sure to tell them how much you appreciate all the ways they are caring for us.

WAYS TO GIVE

This has been an unusual year in many ways. Although we are worshiping inside and outside the church building, we are still unable to spend time with all of you. Through it all, our work as a church continues. Our staff still works, in fact even more hours, to record worship services and handle daily needs. We "visit" our ohana through phone calls and in other creative ways, help with

needs, collect and deliver food, and all the other things it takes to support the congregation and the community.

Without our regular visitors, with some members choosing to move closer to mainland family, and with job loss on the island as across the country, we are now at a point where the gifts coming to KLC are smaller than the expenses we still have to pay. We have gone through the budget to lower or eliminate as many expenses as possible, many resulting from KLC and other groups not being fully open at this time. We received a Payroll Protection Program (PPP) loan from the federal government to cover payroll for a while, but those funds have been used. We now must rely on contributions, which have begun to lag behind expenses.

We are asking for your help if you are able to do so. Please consider making a donation to the continuing life of KLC. Any amount will help. Small contributions blend together to become large blessings. You can give through the church website, www.kiheilutheran.org by clicking on the "Give" button at the top right of the home page. Or you can download the "Givelify" app to your iphone or Android, then search for Kihei Lutheran Church. Both are completely safe and easy to use. Of course, checks in the mail work too.

We look forward to the time when we can all be together again sharing worship and friendship. Until then, our prayers are with all of you. Take care, stay well, and know that you are loved.


