## **Report from the June Council Meeting**

A regular meeting of the KLC Council was held virtually via Zoom on June 15th with a quorum present. The Church Council is studying <u>Power Surge</u>, by Michael W. Ross. The first three chapters were discussed in the hour before the regular meeting, and served as a devotional.

Pastor Joel reported that over the past month he has met with various colleagues including the entire Hukilau Conference. Pastor Joel applied for, and was awarded, a Technology Grant from the synod. The monies will be added to a fund set aside for updating the sanctuary sound, video and internet systems. Additionally, Pastor made phone calls to 17 members and 8 non-members in the last month.

Margie reported that KLC received \$2,198 in offerings in the previous week. The general account balance is \$36,520. The 'Be the Church' fundraising in June will focus on Worship expenses. \$475 has been raised so far. 'Be the Church' in May raised \$1,410 for Office expenses. We are grateful for such blessings.

Renee was absent from the meeting, but she submitted her monthly message. She is especially thankful to everyone who played a part in the PPP loan process. She extends a warm welcome to our newest Council members: Mark Haley, Sara Dickmeyer, and Jack Jorden. Renee is also looking forward to learning more about our congregation's discipleship journey through reading Power Surge.

The next regular virtual meeting will be July 20<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm.



## **Something to Think About**

When you put your offering in the bowl on Sunday, send a check to KLC, or give online, are you giving to the church budget? Or are you giving something you value as yours to God? When the early Jewish community set up their church tent, the people arrived at the altar with, for example, a drink offering to be poured out on the altar, or grain to be burned, or a bird to be killed and its body burned. Then they proceeded to praise God and enter into worship. Think about this for a moment? If you have the proceeded to praise God and enter into worship.



Is that what you really think about your church? I doubt it. You don't go to church on Sunday because it provides a service to you like Hawaii Electric or Spectrum. You go because of your connection with God, your desire to praise and worship Him. You bring your own inspiration and love and plan to leave inspired and loved. There's a reason the offering is placed in the service after the sermon. Pastors use scripture as a basis to offer insight, education and inspiration. What better time for those in the congregation to feel connected in a relationship with God and the gospels in a way that helps them *want* to give.

Keep this in mind next time you are giving your donation to KLC. Are you paying a bill? Are you giving to the budget? Or are you inspired to heighten your relationship with God, which inspires you to give some of what you value to Him?



#### **WAYS TO GIVE**

This has been an unusual year in many ways. Although we are worshiping inside and outside the church building, we are still unable to spend time with all of you. Through it all, our work as a church continues. Our staff still works, in fact even more hours, to record worship services and handle daily needs. We "visit" our ohana through phone calls and in other creative ways, help with

needs, collect and deliver food, and all the other things it takes to support the congregation and the community.

Without our regular visitors, with some members choosing to move closer to mainland family, and with job loss on the island as across the country, we are now at a point where the gifts coming to KLC are smaller than the expenses we still have to pay. We have gone through the budget to lower or eliminate as many expenses as possible, many resulting from KLC and other groups not being fully open at this time. We received a Payroll Protection Program (PPP) loan from the federal government to cover payroll for a while, but those funds have been used. We now must rely on contributions, which have begun to lag behind expenses.

We are asking for your help if you are able to do so. Please consider making a donation to the continuing life of KLC. Any amount will help. Small contributions blend together to become large blessings. Or you can download the "Givelify" app to your iphone or Android, then search for Kihei Lutheran Church. Both are completely safe and easy to use. Of course, checks in the mail work too.

We look forward to the time when we can all be together again sharing worship and friendship. Until then, our prayers are with all of you. Take care, stay well, and know that you are loved.


