Miracle Story from the Lutheran World Relief magazine. Blessed Be

On August 4, 2020, a massive explosion destroyed the port in Beirut, Lebanon. Lutheran World Relief was devastated to learn that as many as 190 people died and more than 300,00 people lost their homes in a city where a serious economic crisis and growing outbreak of COVID-19 were already causing widespread suffering.

Shortly after the blast, LWR learned that three shipping containers holding more than \$600,000 worth of quilts and kits, intended to help refugees and other vulnerable communities in Lebanon, had arrived at the port just six days before the explosion. Initial reports from authorities said the containers had been destroyed – just when their contents could be of most use to families in crisis.

It took weeks for LWR's staff and partners to gain access to the blast site. In addition to the overwhelming humanitarian need they found throughout the city, the port itself was chaos, and safety and security were a challenge. But once officials were able to dig their way through the wreckage, a blessing arose out of the ashes: they found that the containers full of LWR quilts and kits had been shielded from the blast by a large concrete building.

While the containers were damaged, the seals were intact and the material inside had been spares. In just the right place, at just the right time, hope arose out of the darkness.

Our team and partners rejoiced and acted as quickly as they could to mobilize distribution for the most-affected families. Primarily, these families were refugees from Palestine and Syria, who had already fled harrowing situations in their home countries – only to meet more struggle and crisis in Lebanon. Tonight, more than 24,000 children, women and men are wrapped in your love, and blessed to know that even in a difficult time, they are not alone.

Report from the September Council Meeting

A regular meeting of the KLC Council was held virtually via Zoom with a quorum present. The meeting was opened with a devotion and prayer by Joel Rudow.

Pastor Joel reported that over the past month he has worked with the Hale Kau Kau Board to plan their next steps. Pastor has begun a 'Midweek Moment' video devotion that focuses on self-care. Pastor is maintaining the parsonage's landscaping, sprinkler system, and PV system. Pastor worked with Beth and Cate to plan and record two virtual worship services due to the Covid spike. Cate and Pastor are learning how to use the online streaming hardware, which will be used to stream worship services to Facebook. Pastor was able to minister at two deaths this month. Additionally, Pastor made phone calls to 36 members, 5 non-members, and officiated at one wedding in the last month.

Joel Rudow presented the Treasurer's report. The general account balance is \$17,000. It appears as though we will be required to use the memorial funds to meet expenses.

Renee submitted grant applications to the Pacifica Synod for money that will be used to maintain an out-reach program feeding people in need. The grant will help with our monthly commitment to Keolahau Food Pantry and our Thanksgiving Boxes. Finances have been a main focus for Council this year. We currently have a deficit of \$22,000. The PPP loan helped us last year, and the Ray Benson fund will help this year, but we must remain fiscally responsible while we develop the 2022 budget.

Cate reports that she is planning on returning to work in the office October 4.

KLC stewardship campaign will begin in October.

KLC 2022 Budget is in the process of being developed. Committees are submitting their numbers for compilation.

The next regular virtual meeting will be October 19th at 7:00pm.

WAYS TO GIVE

This has been an unusual year in many ways. Although we are worshiping inside and outside the church building, we are still unable to spend time with all of you. Through it all, our work as a church continues. Our staff still works, in fact even more hours, to record worship services and handle daily needs. We "visit" our ohana through phone calls and in other creative ways, help with

needs, collect and deliver food, and all the other things it takes to support the congregation and the community.

Without our regular visitors, with some members choosing to move closer to mainland family, and with job loss on the island as across the country, we are now at a point where the gifts coming to KLC are smaller than the expenses we still have to pay. We have gone through the budget to lower or eliminate as many expenses as possible, many resulting from KLC and other groups not being fully open at this time. We received a Payroll Protection Program (PPP) loan from the federal government to cover payroll for a while, but those funds have been used. We now must rely on contributions, which have begun to lag behind expenses.

We are asking for your help if you are able to do so. Please consider making a donation to the continuing life of KLC. Any amount will help. Small contributions blend together to become large blessings. You can give through the church website, www.kiheilutheran.org by clicking on the "Give" button at the top right of the home page. 
