

Aloha Kihei Lutheran Church Members and friends,

PASTOR I understand that many of you have been concerned about me and my health and where I am at with all of that. I haven't yet given an update due to my mom having been in the hospital close to death with blood clots in her lungs and double pneumonia. I wasn't able to update my family until she was healthy again as I didn't want it to affect her recovery in any way. I updated them the first week of April. And now it's your turn to know how I am doing.

Toward the end of March 2022, I had my first three-month CAT scan and MRI of my abdomen and pelvis to see how things were going in there. This is standard protocol for anyone who has had a cancerous tumor removed from their body. I was anxious and yet excited to see the results of those scans. The scans revealed more tumors in the abdomen and in my lungs. As you can imagine this information was devastating for me and for my family. I have not been given a prognosis, but the oncologist has me on a treatment plan for the next four years and is very optimistic that we can put this cancer in remission. That was encouraging for me.

So, what kind of cancer is it? The cancer is called Renal Cell Carcinoma (clear cell) and unbeknownst to me I have had it since I was twenty-eight years old.

What is the treatment that I am receiving? I am receiving a brand-new cutting-edge treatment that was approved while I was in the hospital after surgery. It is called immunotherapy and is targeted specifically for the cancer that has currently taken up residence inside me. This therapy has been putting people like me who have metastatic disease into remission, even outright curing some.

How does immunotherapy work? This type of cancer has to avoid my immune system for it to continue to grow and so it has many long arms (proteins) and those arms are longer than the immune system cells arms. Think of it like a bully who puts his longer arm on the head of a smaller person who is trying to hit them but can't reach because the bully's longer arms are holding it back. So, the immune system cells can't reach the cancer cells to kill them and so the cancer cells divide and grow. What the immunotherapy medication does is it give the immune system cells swords (so to speak) that allows them to cut the arms of the cancer cells. Now the immune system can get close enough to destroy the cancer cell. There is no place the cancer can run or hide to evade the immune system now. It is being destroyed.

Does it have any side effects? Yes. Lots of them. The biggest side effect that I am experiencing is lots of **pain and inflammation** that moves around my body. Inflammation occurs where the immune system is actively attacking the cancer cells. So, although pain and inflammation are uncomfortable, they are signposts that my body is fighting the cancer. **Fatigue** is another symptom. My muscles get really tired really fast, and my body has put most of its energy into fighting off the cancer. I'm also experiencing Mouth sores. Sensitive hearing. Ringing in the ears. Dizziness. Irritability. Sadness. Stress. Muscle cramps. Blurry vision. Anxiety. Insomnia. Micro twitching in my legs...

What can I do to help?

It's totally understandable that you would want to help me and my family in any way that you possibly can. Helping gives us a sense of control during a time where we feel out of control. And I want to be able to give that to you.

How you can help.

Letter's, cards, emails of encouragement are a wonderful and meaningful way of support.

Occasional premade dinners. Contact Mutual Ministry first. Phil Proctor, Renee Romerdahl, Marilyn Hopkins.

Sign up to help our church committees (Ministry Teams) to take some of the weight off.

Continue to give your offering to the church and give more than you have before. The church body is important. KLC is important, and to know that I don't have to worry about the church's finances would be a huge burden taken off my shoulders.

Grant me grace and understanding when I just can't seem to make it to the office.

Pray for me but in a very specific way that I will teach you.

Prayer Class

I would like to teach a class on prayer and the powerful creative ways in which we can pray. God has given us amazingly creative minds that can be utilized in creative prayer. I am not certain when the class will start, soon most likely and will take place on Sunday mornings after worship in the worship space. It will be 30 minutes to an hour long and will take place over two maybe three Sundays consecutively. I will post an example of creative prayer at the end of this letter.

Mutual Ministry Team

The Mutual Ministry Team is headed up by Phil Proctor along with Marilyn Hopkins and Renee Romerdahl. They will be made aware of any updates to my health on a weekly basis and will be able to help answer your questions as we move forward.

Will I be able to work?

Yes. I am able to work full time and look forward to it every day. I will be posting the hours that I am in the office very soon so that you can come and visit with me, and we can talk, and I can answer any questions that you might have. I am also available to help with any spiritual needs or prayers that you might be needing as well. Just let me know. There will be times where I am unable to come into the office because I'm just not feeling strong enough to get here. But please know that even though I am not physically sitting at my desk in the office I am still working at home and communicating with Cate in the running of the church facility, calling people to chat, planning, doing sermon prep, researching, and praying for each of you.

Communication

I understand the importance of communication during times like these when your pastor is dealing with some very difficult challenges. To keep the rumor mill suppressed and to ensure that correct information is being communicated, we (Pastor and Mutual Ministry) will be publishing in the bulletin and eblast a short update as to what is happening. We will also publish my immunotherapy infusion dates and any other significant scans and tests that I might have to endure. I want to be totally transparent with you all and keep you in the know. That way you will know how to pray for me as well.

Speaking of Prayer, here is the example of imaginative prayer that I was talking about before.

There are five steps that you can follow in this prayer for me.

- 1. Close your eyes and calm your body and your mind. Begin by praising God for all of the wonderful things that God has done in your life. Feel the sense of gratitude flowing out from your heart and truly give thanks and praise to God. Spend some time doing this, maybe 2-3 minutes or longer if you'd like.
- 2. Next, in your mind's eye, bring your attention to me. See what I look like and hold me up. Imagine that you can see inside of my abdomen and lungs (gross I know) and all of the cancer cells and tumors, but don't see them as gross lumps of ugliness. No, imagine them as clusters of beautiful shining diamonds. Just let your imagination move your awareness. There may be a lot of diamonds or very few. The location, size, shape etc. doesn't matter because you are looking at a spiritual representation of the cancer.
- 3. Now, imagine all your unconditional love and gratitude flowing out of you as a bright white light and shooting into each diamond that is there. Also imagine that God's unconditional love is shining into each diamond with a light brighter than any other. Filling those diamonds with love to their absolute capacity. Now imagine those diamonds becoming fragile because of the shear amount of love flowing in. Becoming brittle, flaking, and finally dissolving into nothingness until they're gone.
- 4. Next, see my body filled with that same unconditional love light, healed, and transformed.
- 5. Finally, give thanks to God for God's complete healing that has occurred in my body. And for the lessons learned and the changes that have occurred within body and soul. End with Amen. Or so be it.

Council Secretary's Report from the April 2022 Council Meeting

A regular meeting of the KLC Council was held virtually via Zoom with a quorum present. The meeting was opened with a prayer by Margie Terluin.

Pastor Joel was absent from the April Council meeting. Renee gave an update on Pastor's latest health report. The Mutual Ministry Team and/or Pastor will inform the congregation at the upcoming Congregation meeting.

Renee's report expresses thanks to the Worship team for enhancing our Holy Week and Easter services. The KLC live stream is gaining more viewers. Our in-person worship is changing with Covid-19 restrictions loosening.

Margie's Treasurer's report states that KLC has a bank balance of approximately \$42,395. Year-to-date income was \$94,434; and year to date expenses were \$86,410. Weekly giving was surprisingly low especially given that it was the Holy Week and Easter.

The Nominating Committee has three people to put on the ballot for the Congregation meeting on Sunday, April 24, 2022.

Monthly money transferred into the Reserve Properties Funds will be suspended through December 2022.

The next regular virtual meeting will be May 17th at 7:00pm.


