So, pray for one another and for the world. Envision God's unconditional love surrounding both the people of KLC and Maui, and those in Uvalde and Buffalo.

time, our hearts our heavy as we remember the students in Ulvade, Texas, who have not only lost their summer plans, but their lives. It is beyond tragic for their families and our country. Our hearts and prayers go out to their families and their community.

Life is always uncertain, every day we have is a gift from God for which we need to remember to be thankful. We need to remember to pray for each other and support each other in difficult times as well as the good times. Our church has been under a lot of changes and stress due to both external and internal causes. This is a time when we need to be united, more than ever, working together as one. We Are The Church! We need to be unified as one, strengthening our relationships with one another, our congregation, and with God.

In the Gospel lesson for May 29, we heard John 17:20-26, where Jesus states "I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one—I in them and you in me—so that they may be brought to complete unity." A regular meeting of the KLC Council was held virtually via Zoom with a quorum present. The meeting was opened with a prayer by Sue Moorcroft.

Pastor Joel was absent from the May Council meeting. Mutual Ministry, through Renee, gave an update on Pastors latest health report.

Renee's report outlined her work with Mutual Ministry to support Pastor Joel. She stepped in twice, unexpectedly, to lead our worship service in the past month.

Margie's Treasurer's report states that KLC has a bank balance of approximately \$36,496. Year to date income was \$113,861: and year to date expenses were \$112,689. Weekly giving was low again this week, at \$1,605.

The next regular virtual meeting will be June 20 at 7:00pm.


