Aloha KLC,

After I finished writing a newsletter article for this month's newsletter, I realized that the content of that article was, for lack of a better term, dense. After re-reading it, and in discussion with our Stewardship leader (also financial secretary, communications director, et al.), I realized that another thought was burning in the back of my mind and within my heart.

I don't know if you have noticed this, but when you come into church on any given Sunday, it just doesn't look like it did 5 years ago. Then we might have seen 100 or so people in worship during the summer months, now we see 30-40. This can be a bit disheartening for many of us because it brings about the logical conclusion in our minds that since there appears to be fewer people coming, then people must have left. If people have left the church, where did they go? Why did they leave? Etc. etc. These thoughts and questions tend to be rather scary and can often spin out of control, create anxiety, and take on a life of their own amongst the membership.

What if I told you that the low attendance on Sunday that we are "seeing" is in fact an illusion? I'm not trying to gaslight anyone reading this who attends in person on Sundays. But it is truly an illusion.

Because of covid, we at KLC have had to implement many changes in the way we "do church" - administer, outreach, pastoral care, congregational care, worship, etc. etc. etc. Those were trying times and the times are still difficult. The need for change was forced upon us. If some changes hadn't happened quickly, then the church would have ceased to exist. Some changes are still necessary.

One of those important changes we made was how we got the worship service and sermon out to the people when we couldn't meet in person. So, we recorded worship, edited, and posted the worship service to each member and friend. Later we received a grant to purchase the equipment we needed to make it possible to live-stream the worship service. This was very successful. Different, new, and convenient for people even during these post-covid times. People from all over the world and Maui, are now tuning in each week to watch and participate in worship with us every week. Last week, while we may have had 35 people in person during worship, we had another 100 or more people tuned in to the live-stream and the recorded version that gets posted on the website. That's over 135 people in attendance for that Sunday! We might not see these people with our eyes. As much as we would like to see them in person and spend fellowship time with them, that's just not always possible. This is a new age in which we are living, that is calling for new and different ways of doing the things that we have always done a certain, comfortable way.

We would be remiss if we didn't embrace the online viewers as part of the worshipping community of KLC. One thing we are trying to do is figure out how we can engage with our online worshippers more efficiently. If anyone has any ideas about engagement with the online viewers, I would like to encourage you to bring your ideas to me or any of the congregational leaders. 135 people in worship last week. That's a blessing! I'm excited to see how many we get to share worship with this week.

Attendance is historically low during the summer months at KLC, as is our giving. Even though we may not be physically present, our services and financial expenses continue. This is the time when we especially need offerings and financial support in order to meet expenses. Establishing scheduled giving is one of the best solutions for helping us with funds needed to have a balanced budget in the summer. You can easily set up scheduled giving on the Givelify App where you can set up reoccurring weekly, twice monthly or monthly gifts. You can also choose to give without setting up reoccurring gifts. This is extremely helpful as it allows us to continue to give while we are away during the summer months.

If you haven't had an opportunity to try Givelify, it is quite easy and safe to use. You can either download the app, or you can reach it through our website at kiheilutheran.org You will find an orange rectangular button at the top right corner of our website that says Give. Click on this button and you will go directly to Givelify. Then simply select the amount you wish to give and follow the prompts.

We are especially grateful for the summer offerings that we receive. Scheduled offerings are just one way to give during the summer months. Of course, you can always give in person, or by mailing a check to the church office. If you are financially able, you might also consider giving a little extra during this time. Any amount helps as small contributions blend together to become larger blessings.

We are extremely grateful for the many gifts you share with our congregation. The sharing of monetary gifts to keep our ministry going are just one of them. We are blessed by your time, talents, and love that you show to KLC.

Council Secretary's Report from the June 2022 Council Meeting

A regular meeting of the KLC Council was held virtually via Zoom with a quorum present. Council welcomed as guests our newest council members;

Zel Terluin, Larry Manning, and Don Sauer. The meeting was opened with a devotion and prayer by Holly Pendergast.

Pastor Joel was absent from the June Council meeting, and he did not submit a report. Renee reported that she remains busy taking care of KLC. She filled in for Pastor one Sunday, and Beth the next. She attended a motivational workshop, reviewed membership rolls, and met with several committees among other things. Renee will be off-island for several weeks; if anything should come up, please reach out to Vice President Sarah Dickmeyer, Admin Assistant Cate, or Pastor Joel.

Margie's Treasurer's report states that KLC has a bank balance of approximately \$38,026. Year to date income was \$138,975; and year to date expenses were \$137,864. Weekly giving was \$1,046.

The Finance Committee was given permission to create a stewardship taskforce, and Cate was given permission to work with the Outreach Committee on our annual rubber slipper drive.




