Aloha ohana,

PASTOR These past two-and-a-half years have been rough, not only on us as individuals and as a community, but also on the entire church and our KLC congregation. Covid brought about such devastation to the world and to our local community that when I look back I can barely believe we went through such a thing. The loss that has been experienced has been huge.

Because of all of the losses we have had over the course of those two-and-a-half years, many of us have a lot of emotions, concerns, and maybe even some confusion as to how to deal with it all. When I counsel individuals who have lost a loved one or experienced a great trauma in their lives, I speak to them about the importance of grieving the loss. If it's the death of a loved one, understanding the grief of not having that person around anymore is very important especially in the process of healing. If it's surviving trauma, it's important to unpack that trauma, recognize the loss, grieve the losses, and move toward healing. When we remain in the place of the past, how things used to be, we remain in the trauma/loss, and we fail to move forward in our healing. Doing the work to healing ourselves is vitally important in the healing process.

Like those who have lost loved ones or experienced trauma, we as a community who follows the way of Jesus have experienced collective losses over the years especially due to Covid-19. It's time that we as a community experience healing by beginning the grieving process. On October 22 the community of KLC, members, associate members, visitors, guests, youth, whoever wants to participate, will gather for a potluck and for a time of remembrance.

The Evening of Remembrance, as we're calling it, will be a time where we can remember the history of our congregation. The good times and bad times. Times of growth and times of recession. Significant events in the life of our church as well as the many losses that we have experienced over the years, as well as traditions that we wish to bring back.

Your voice and participation in this event are very important to us. This is the first step that KLC is making toward healing and reinventing ourselves, finding our new identity in mission and ministry and vision as well as our values. Please join us in this event. All are welcome.

and we even had our first potluck! We have missed so much during the past couple of years due to the pandemic.



Council Secretary's Report from the September 2022 Council Meeting

A regular meeting of the KLC Council was held virtually via Zoom with a quorum present. The meeting was opened with a devotion and prayer by Renee Romerdahl.

Pastor Joel reports that he made home visits or calls to twelve church members and seven non-members. He also performed two baptisms and one funeral in the past month. He worked with the Stewardship Task Force. He prepared for the Bishop's visit, and spent time with him. He is planning the Evening of Remembrance. He participated in the Hukilau Conference via Zoom.

Renee reports that she prepared for Bishop Nagler's visit, and met with him. She has been exploring signage options for our church, helped with God's Work Our Hands, and worked on the 2023 budget. She is looking forward to our Evening of Remembrance which will occur in October. "This will be a very special evening for our congregation and friends to share memories of KLC, express our grief over losses and lament. This will be a very important step for our congregation as we have experienced a tremendous amount of losses during the past few years and need to acknowledge them and begin to heal as a congregation."

The Treasurer's report states that KLC has a bank balance of approximately \$25,636. Year to date income was \$192,433; and year to date expenses were \$212,788. Weekly giving last week was \$1,505.

The next regular virtual meeting will be October 18 at 7:00pm via Zoom.
