PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This past month KLC held an Evening of Remembrance during which we created a timeline, shared memories, had a service of lament, and burned our losses as a symbolic method of letting go of them. I have heard questions about



why we did this and comments that we don't want to forget the past. Yes, we do not want to forget the past, however we also don't want the past to hold us back from the future. It is easy to get trapped in the thought pattern of wanting to exactly replicate the past without room for change or growth. Instead, we want to recall the "Glory Days" the special events of the past, to acknowledge them, as well as our losses, and the affect they both had on KLC. If you study the timeline that was created you may see some patterns, you will also see how KLC has overcome challenges, obstacles and losses in the past.

We currently face another loss, as Pastor Joel has announced that he has gone back on disability. While it is a loss, it is also a gain for Pastor Joel, as it will allow him to take care of himself and focus on healing during a very difficult time in his life. We wish for nothing but the best for Pastor Joel and pray for his continued healing.

Many of you may have noticed that our lawns are brown and plants are withering. This is because we have turned off the irrigation system to help reduce costs. The church council has trimmed the budget as much as possible, but our expenses are still exceeding our income. This is yet another loss as membership and visitors, and percentages of giving have declined along with our income.

As we easily recognize our losses, we must also recognize and celebrate our blessings. This month we will be focusing on gratitude and thanksgiving for all that we have. While KLC has many losses, it also has so much to be thankful for. We may face challenges but when we stop and reflect on the positives, we cannot help but be grateful. We have an amazing church, facilities, programs, and people that make KLC a loving, caring ohana that touches the lives of so many.

This year's theme for the month of November is Mahalo Nui Loa God/Thank You Very Much God. It is a time to give thanks to God for all the blessings we have in our lives, remembering that all we have comes from God. God provides for us, and wants us to share with others. It is through tithing, and financial gifts and offerings that we have been able to have facilities, programs, staff and services at KLC. These would not be possible without the financial support of members and friends of KLC. Please prayerfully consider as to how you can help support KLC monetarily when completing your pledge card.

Reflecting on our best and recognizing all that we have will help us to move into the future. What will the future look like? I trust that God has a plan for us. I am working closely with Bishop Nagler to help our leadership guide us into the future, and he is working on finding an interim pastor for us. This fall Kihei Lutheran celebrates 35 years of ministry. Together we will build upon our strengths and move into the next 35 years of ministry.

Council Secretary's Report from the October 2022 Council Meeting

A regular meeting of the KLC Council was held virtually via Zoom with a quorum present. The meeting was opened with a devotion and prayer by Don Sau-

er.

Pastor Joel was unable to attend but submitted his report stating that he made home visits or calls to seven church members and eight non-members. The following are the highlights of his work this past month: Planning three events called the Evening of Remembrance, the Evening of Gratitude and Blessing, and

New Year, New Day, New Way; Researching what it would take for KLC to become a 'Reconciled in Christ' congregation; Spoke several times with Bishop Nagler; and

Researched ways to connect with the folks who attend our Sunday services on-line;

Renee reports that she has been working on the new signage for our church, working with the Stewardship Task Force, and pulling together the Evening of Remembrance along with two other events planned for November and January.

Margie reports that KLC has a bank balance of approximately \$22,949. Year to date income was \$243,810; and year to date expenses were \$257,301. Weekly giving and rent last week were \$2,234.

The council spent the majority of this meeting finalizing the 2023 budget. We are also working on getting the abandoned car off of the property.

The next regular virtual meeting will be November 15 at 7:00pm via Zoom.


