#### February is Pay-Down-the Mortgage Month

We currently have a mortgage in the amount of \$400,696.65 that is paid from our general fund. The monthly payment is \$2,537, and of that \$1,044.23 went toward principal for January 2023 and \$1,492.77 went toward interest (this changes monthly). We were able to pay \$14,685.82 on principal in 2022. Every time we pay extra on the principal, we are a bit closer to closing the mortgage. More on principal means we pay less interest, the principal payment rises, and we are another step closer to being debt free.

It would be great if we could use that money to help the community. To get closer to that goal, the entire month of February will be Pay-Down-the-Mortgage month. We are asking you to donate with the promise that everything collected will go directly on the principal, allowing us to pay off the mortgage more quickly.

As an **incentive** to giving, two members of our church have generously offered **\$25,000** in **matching funds**. That means every \$1.00 you give will have the effect of \$2.00. That includes all the money put in the Be-the-Change box. Since we anticipate your generosity, we will have a fishbowl for overflow. When that overflows, we will provide another container. We will take change, small bills, large bills, small checks, large checks, stocks or whatever else you would like to donate. You can put your donation in one of these containers, put it in the Sunday collection bowl, pay on Givelify or mail it to the office. No donation is too small or too big. Every penny your can offer is greatly appreciated.

For those who watch the live stream or find us on Facebook, know that we consider you all part of our 'ohana. Even though you are not physically with us in the building, we see your names and your comments and know you are part of Kihei Lutheran Church. We hope you feel this connection as well and want to help us pay down this debt so we can use future donations to help God's people.

As a **thank you** for your participation and your donations, Marilyn Hopkins, financial secretary and chair of the stewardship team, has offered to provide a special homemade refreshment item for each Sunday in February. We wish we could share these refreshments with those who watch our online services, but the technology to send baked goods through streaming has not yet been invented.

Please pray for how you can help toward this major fundraiser. As we become debt free, we can move on to doing God's work. Together we will make a difference.

It has been and will continue to be a whirlwind pace for the foreseeable future. I have already had 2 meetings with some other local pastors, a meeting with the KLC Community Outreach and Assistance Team and my first KLC Church Council. So far all I see are dynamic and engaged leaders, and what a blessing they are. I have also already had my first visitors from Alaska staying at the parsonage and dinner with a niece and her husband from Idaho.

On the Sunday afternoon before I left to come here on Monday, the vast majority but not all of my family in Alaska gathered for January birthdays and to send me on my way to you. A picture of the group and a picture of wife (in the heavy red coat) and 3 of her 5 sisters are below.

## Council Secretary's Report from the January 2023 Council Meeting

A regular meeting of the KLC Council was held virtually via Zoom with a quorum present. The meeting was opened with a devotion and prayer by Margie Terluin.

The Council welcomed our interim Pastor, Ron Rucker to the Council. Pastor Ron reports that he has already met with local clergy, as well as some of our Committees.

Council President, Renee Romerdahl has been busy this past month. The following is a list of her activities:

- Held conversations with Bishop Naglar regarding the interim minister position, met with Administration and Executive team to develop the interim minister contract, and wrote the interim minister contract and presented it to Pastor Rucker; Coordinated travel arrangements with Pastor Ron; and Found temporary housing for Pastor Ron.
- Met with Administration and Executive teams to develop the preshool contract for 2023-2024, and wrote the preschool contract and sent it to Little Hoku Preschool along with a letter.
- Visited the parsonage with Zel, making a priority list of projects; asked the congregation for their help with the parsonage; had my husband demolish the bathroom tub and tile surround, replace it, fix irrigation, light fixtures, replace broken fans, move furniture, take multiple trips to the dump, weed the front

yard, and more; purchased a new dryer and queen bed for the parsonage; shopped for and purchased all bedding, small electrical appliances and other items on my list; and helped work on the parsonage.

- Led worship and delivered the message on Sunday, January 1.
- Wrote e-blasts and messages for the newsletter and bulletins.
- Sneaked away for five days to help my mother move into assisted living in Bellevue, WA.

Treasurer, Margie Terluin reports that KLC has a bank balance of approximately \$32,997. Year to date income was \$18,238; and year to date expenses were \$11,440. Weekly giving and rent last week was \$3,000.

KLC will hold a Congregational Meeting on February 19, 2023 to present annual committee reports and elect a Council Member Nomination Team. Janet Harp and Keli Nelson's term on Council will come to an end this year. They will work with other congregants to recruit five to six people to join the Council.

The next regular virtual meeting will be February 21st at 7:00pm via Zoom.






