### **HOLY WEEK SCHEDULE**

#### **Holy Week—What to Expect**

#### Palm Sunday

Today's liturgy begins with a palm procession, commemorating Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Quickly the tone of the service changes as we meditate upon Jesus' passion and death. Because this story is so central to our faith, we hear Matthew's account of the passion today and John's version on Good Friday. Though Jesus is obedient even unto death on the cross, he is exalted by God. We gather to remember his offering for the life of the world, and to be fed by his life-giving mercy. This holy week will culminate in the celebration of the Three Days of Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection.

#### Maundy Thursday

With nightfall our Lenten observance comes to an end, and we gather with Christians around the world to celebrate the Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection. At the heart of the Maundy Thursday liturgy is Jesus' commandment to love one another. As Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, we are called to follow his example as we humbly care for one another, especially the poor and the unloved. At the Lord's table we remember Jesus' sacrifice of his life, even as we are called to offer ourselves in love for the life of the world.

#### **Good Friday**

The service is based on the Stations of The Cross-a devotion that was developed in the Middle Ages by the Franciscans as a way of allowing people who could not travel to the Holy Land to walk where Christ walked on the day of his passion. By the end of the 17th century many churches had stations, or stops, arranged at intervals along their walls, each with a cross and beneath that cross a representation of an event in the passion narrative. Nine of the fourteen stations are taken directly from scripture; the other five come out of the earliest traditions of the church. Each station has a devotion wherein a narrator will speak, followed by a meditation or thought. Following the meditation there will be a prayer, after which a candle will be extinguished, signifying the ebb of Christ's life.

#### **Easter Sunday**

On this day the Lord has acted! On the first day of the week God began creation, transforming darkness into light. On this, the "eighth day" of the week, Jesus Christ was raised from the dead. We celebrate this new creation in the waters of baptism and in the feast of victory. With great joy we celebrate this day of days, even as we begin the great fifty days of Easter. Filled with hope, we go forth to share the news that Christ is risen!

PASTOR My wife, Nanette, and I wish to express our amazement and gratitude at the overwhelming care, graciousness, hospitality, and kindness we have received from all of you who are part of the KLC community. She has been trying to manage her work schedule to keep some evenings somewhat open and most of Sundays. This will become more difficult for her over the next few weeks as another tax deadline approaches. She and I will be returning to Alaska around April 24<sup>th</sup> or 25<sup>th</sup>. I will only be gone a week but it will include a Sunday, April 30<sup>th</sup>. Nanette will be gone two or three weeks more than I.

Music, especially church music, is very important to us. She has been accompanying church music for approximately 60 years and I have been singing in churches and elsewhere almost that long. For Easter, Beth has been working with a group of six to eight persons on a four part tenor/bass hymn. A men's quartet has also begun gathering at the parsonage on Monday nights to begin putting together some more special music. Finally, we are hoping with council's blessing to begin an expanded choir program this fall. If you are interested in singing in the choir or doing some special music, let Beth or Cate know. I will not encourage you to tell me because, truth be told, I'll probably forget to tell those other important persons.

Speaking of council, elections are coming up. As someone with extensive lay leadership experience in the past, I cannot overemphasize the importance of the council to the function and ministry of KLC or any church. Both members and associate members may be elected to council. Members have both voice and vote. Associate members have voice but not voting privileges. The current council has been operating at three-fourths strength and two members are required to terminate their council service per our constitution. That means that there are five vacancies to be filled, so, if you are interested and willing to serve on council please let one of the nominating committee members know.

By the way, this council is hugely important over the next year or so because they are the driving force behind the Transition Team and the Call Committee. Those two groups will have immense impact on who and when a permanent pastor comes to serve KLC.

Prepare yourselves because the busy time of Holy Week and Easter is upon us. Looking forward to seeing you in the many different worship opportunities.

Finally, I have not and will not talk much about stewardship because I was raised with stewardship being personal. Stewardship is, however, key to our Christian life, and the viability of any congregation. Do not get me wrong, stewardship is service, both financially and physically. In order for KLC to do what we believe we are being called to do takes both your money **and** you. It is almost real baseball season, so the question is, will you step up to the plate.

A regular meeting of the KLC Council was held virtually via Zoom with a quorum present. The meeting was opened with a devotion and prayer by Janet Harp.

Pastor Ron reported that he continues to meet with individuals and groups. He has begun telephoning past congregants. Adult education is going well. Lenten services will move to 5:00

Council President, Renee Romerdahl, reported on the following activities for the church. Interior work in the parsonage was completed in time for Pastor Ron's wife's arrival on February 27. The Mutual Ministry held our first meeting with Pastor Ron on February 27. We will continue to meet on a monthly basis. Planning has begun for the parsonage landscaping project. We are hoping to have stumps ground on Sunday, March 26, and we are looking at another date in April for a work party at the parsonage. We continue to see familiar faces at church on Sunday and have welcomed many visitors from the mainland and Canada. Pastor JP called to check in with me; he continues to keep us in his prayers and offer his support.

Treasurer, Margie Terluin, reports that last week's giving and rent was \$1,626. Year-to-date income was \$63,615. Year-to-date expenses were \$53,810. We have a bank balance of approximately \$38,738.

## **How Can I Help?**


Here are a few suggestions of things you can do for April. Of course, you are encouraged to join in anywhere you see a need or want to be a part.




