Email me as soon as possible so that we can make a decision on building this new KLC group. A decision will need to be made by July 1. <u>beth@willsmaui.com</u>


How Can I Help?

The backyard has been transformed! Sprouts of green should be appearing very shortly! I am so grateful to all the volunteers who helped with this project as it wouldn't have been possible without all of you.

Our annual April Congregational Meeting was also held this month to elect members to the KLC Church Council. The 2023-34 Church Council terms will begin on July 1, 2023. Our newly elected members are Dave Ballaine, Joshua Gonzalez and Vicki Nelson. Sarah Dickmeyer, Mark Haley and I were elected to serve a second term. Council Secretary's Report from the March 2023 Council Meeting

A regular meeting of the KLC Council was held virtually via Zoom with a quorum present. The meeting was opened with a devotion and prayer by Mark Haley.

Pastor Ron reports that he continues to meet with individuals and groups. The Transition Team for calling a new pastor will begin next month. Pastor will be off island for one week starting April 24th and return the following Monday. Pastor emphasizes the importance of greeting folks before service in addition to the '3 minutes' after.

Council President, Renee Romerdahl, reports that much of her work this past month has been centered on the parsonage landscaping and solar panels. Easter and Lent were beautifully celebrated, and many visitors have complimented our services. Renee will start working with Pastor at the beginning of May on the process of starting the transition team

An inspection of the church property's water systems revealed some major problems that are required by the County of Maui to be remediated. The Property Team is working to get the project started.

Janet Harp, with the Finance Committee, reports that last week's giving was \$3,851. Year to date income was \$90,239. Year to date expenses were \$76,386.

The next regular virtual meeting will be May 16th at 7:00pm via Zoom.




