Aloha from Pastor Ron,

Hurricane season and summer have arrived. That means two things: first, attendance and giving at worship are down mostly because many members are off island visiting family. Yes, we may have more visitors but they probably have home congregations that they are supporting even while they are gone. That means that it is important that those who are part of our ohana are needed to continue to support KLC and its ministries. And yes, expenses are down but that is mostly because I am a pretty inexpensive pastor. There are some potential costly items staring us in the face, and the next pastor will most likely require more support than I do.

The second thing about this time of year is that Nanette is back and our daughter, Julie; her three kids; Reagan, Paxson, and Knox; and later her husband, Josh, are on island for all of June and part of July.

I am looking forward to the new council convening in July. Renee and I have been meeting almost weekly to acquire the documents we think the Transition Team will need to begin to do their work. If you would like to serve on the six or seven member Transition Team, please let Renee, myself, or the office know in writing.

The primary function of the Transition Team is to write the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). When completed the MSP is posted online throughout the ELCA churchwide. It allows pastors looking for a new call to get an initial look at KLC and KLC's needs. If they are interested in being considered for the KLC vacancy they, then, submit their paperwork for further consideration. In order to prepare the MSP, the Transition Team needs complete and good answers to three questions: Who are we? Who is our neighbor? And what is God calling us to do? The answers to these questions need to be realistic. Remember that the church of our youth, that most of us older individuals remember fondly, no longer really exists. So, what is our niche? Maybe take time to read some online articles about what churches are becoming today, or feel free to talk to me?

The grass is growing in the parsonage backyard. There are a few spots that are still being difficult but I actually mowed a few spots and weed wacked a few other spots in the backyard on May 26th. If you are in the neighborhood, you know – on island, stop by and check it out.

I speak often about grace and law. In my opinion, most churches that appear to be "thriving" preach law or prosperity. In my homily on May 28<sup>th</sup> I mentioned comments by Martin Luther in his "Augsburg Confessions" on the beliefs of the anabaptists. Simply speaking, their focus is on what I do to earn my salvation or the law. I do not believe that this is what Christ taught or even asks of us. Martin Luther had another saying that I think also addresses this concept: "To be convinced in our hearts that we have forgiveness of sin and peace with God by grace alone is the hardest thing." Why? Because it takes us out of the equation and we don't like that. Somehow, I think that is what sin is, period.

# President's REPORT

### **Presidents Message**

As you all are aware, Kihei Lutheran is in the process of transition. Pastor Ron joined us in January as our interim minister and has been supporting and assisting us for the past several months. It is now time to begin forming a transition team. The transition team usually has 5-7 members who are responsible for research, analysis, documentation and a self study of the congregation, its ministry, and our community. The work of the transition team will include:

- Studying the congregation and surrounding community
- · Developing questionnaires and compiling the data
- · Leading small discussion groups with members and friends of the congregation
- Establishing and affirming core values of the congregation
- Help in developing and/or affirming our mission statement
- · Affirming our vision statement
- Defining our purpose and direction
- Discovering who we are and what God is calling us to do
- Assessing the congregation's financial reality and stewardship of resources
- Identifying our congregation's strengths, challenges, and needs
- Working to identify the strengths, skills, and gifts required of our future pastor
- Compiling information and writing the ministry site profile document (which is then sent to the Synod)

The transition team's work is completed once the ministry site profile has been approved by the congregation and is accepted by the Synod office. Once the ministry site profile is completed, a Call Committee will be formed whose work will be to identify the candidate who is best suited to lead our congregation into the future.

There is a time commitment required in being a part of the transition team. The team will usually meet weekly, and members will need to attend/lead some additional meetings with members of the congregation. The transition team will be selected at the July Church Council meeting. Our goal is to have the ministry site profile completed by the end of the year and ready to post by January. If you are interested in serving on this committee, please give it prayerful consideration, and then contact the church office.

# Council Secretary's Report from the May 2023 Council Meeting

A regular meeting of the KLC Council was held virtually via Zoom with a quorum present. The meeting was opened with a devotion and prayer by Sarah Dickmeyer.

Pastor Ron reports that he has had trouble receiving calls with his cell phone. He is addressing the issue with his service provider. He officiated a vow renewal service last week. He is meeting with the Monday Faith Journey group. He is working with Renee on Transition Team formation, including obtaining census data for Kihei and Maui County. He continues to work on our constitution. He will be attending a Pastor's conference on Kauai in the fall, and will need housing.

Council President, Renee Romerdahl, reports that this past month our congregation elected Vicki Nelson, Dave Ballaine, and Joshua Gonzalez as new members which will begin their terms on July 1, 2023. They also reelected Sarah Dickmeyer and herself to a second term. Pastor Ron will be installing at a church service that has yet to be determined. She has been working with Pastor on preparing for the Transition Team to get started. She will be off-island over the summer, returning July 13<sup>th</sup>.

Treasurer, Margie Terluin reported that last week's giving was \$1,926. Year-to-date income was \$116,804. Year-to-date expenses were \$96,354. It was noted that Pastor Ron's compensation package is giving us a surplus.

The next regular virtual meeting will be July 18<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm via Zoom.

### **Community Outreach Update**



The funds collected in January for Be the Change and the Noisy offering went to God's Global Barnyard through the ELCA. We received \$668 and were able to donate 5 Goats, 1 Fish Farm, 6 Chicks, 2 Honeybees, and 2 Piglets. For our second Noisy Offering of the year, we were able to donate



\$313.30 to the Kihei Youth Center. From our monthly food donations to Keolahou Food Pantry we have gathered 1,544 items so far this year. Mahalo to everyone for all your donations.

Be the Change for June will go toward more support for the Worship team. They need funds for communion supplies, environmental items, sound equipment improvements (which are always ongoing) etc... Any additional funds to this team only helps us to enhance our services.

Christmas in July is coming next month. Since half of the year will be over, we to get a jump start on hygiene items, for our end of the year Outreach Ministries. More information will be coming during the middle of the month.





We thank everyone for their ongoing support, either monthly by bringing food the 1st Sunday of the month or by their financial support of the food pantry, and other Outreach projects.


