PASTOR I wish to share first with you a sad update concerning Pastor Joel. Joel's cancer has not been responding to treatment and has, in fact, spread to part of his brain which is causing pain and hallucinations. We need to increase our prayer efforts on behalf of Joel, Mandy, Ezra, Rowan, and family and friends asking God for comfort, healing, peace, and strength always remembering to ask that God's will be done.

We anticipate resurrection of the music program in September. A new quartet has been meeting at the parsonage off and on this summer and we are getting ready to sing for you. Also, at the July Council meeting, the council approved reinstatement of the choir position. Beth has set up a get together for musicians the end of August with rehearsals beginning early in September. Thanks to all who are interested in providing special music to enhance our worship experiences. On that line, I believe I have been remiss in thanking those who have already been steady enhancers of worship at KLC. First, there are Mark and Zel who do the Pu Wehe at the start of every service. Then there those who sing the Kyries and the Psalm; Keli, Stacie, and Zel. Then there is also mister do-it-all Phil and his gourd drum and trumpet. And finally, there is Sally and the Hula dancers. There is also the chimers or ding-a-lings as I call them and Larry and Stacie who sang at Easter. Also there were Cate and Don who filled in on the keyboard. I know I am probably missing some of you and I apologize. But most importantly the one who keeps everything organized and pulled together is Beth. I do not think I can say enough about the quality and quantity of music here at KLC, which is all shepherded by Beth. Again, thanks to all.

We now have a Transition Team who is beginning a slow process of defining who KLC was, is, and should be. There will be meetings and surveys to gather input from congregational members. This process ultimately leads to a Ministry Site Profile (MSP). Once the MSP is approved by the congregation it is made available to the Synod Bishop and is put online throughout the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America organization. That way our MSP is available for many pastors to look at if they are for some reason interested in a change of call or a new call. After the MSP is approved, then a Call Committee will be appointed to review the applications of those pastors interested in being considered for call to KLC provided to us by the Bishop . Because we had no interest expressed in serving on the Transition Team by congregational members, the council discussed our backup plan and five council members volunteered to serve as the Transition Team. They are: Dave Ballaine, Mark Haley, Vicki Nelson, Renee Romerdahl and Zel Terluin. Thanks for stepping up to the plate.

This Transition Team process reminded me of a recent conversation I had with a former KLC member who now lives on the mainland. I call this the tale of two congregations. They were expressing regret, so to speak, that the church they were now attending seemed to have no opportunities for new members to serve. This is one style of congregation which is offset by congregations, more like KLC, that struggle to get enough volunteers to fill all the service positions and so we overload the volunteers we have. Remember, it takes a village, not 2 or 3 streets, to raise a child or serve a church in God's kingdom. Thanks for being such a welcoming and wonderful congregation but we still need to be better.

Time of Transition at KLC

A transition team report

We have five members of the congregation who will be serving on the transition team. Those members are Dave Balline, Mark Haley, Vicki Nelson, Renee Romerdahl and Zel Terluin. They met this past week with Pastor Ron to begin their work of helping the congregation to transition from our past to the future. In the next couple of months we will be reflecting on our past; looking at who we were as well as who we are today. We will revisit nostalgic memories, recognize losses that we have experi-

enced, and celebrate our strengths. These reflections can give us assurance the God is with us, even as we acknowledge and grieve what we have lost, and will give us strength to move forward as a congregation.

We are not alone in our losses, as many congregations across the nation and globally have been suffering similar losses to ours. Congregations have aging members, empty pews, a lack of young families, children and youth, declining offerings, lack of participation, ending of programs, and a lack of people entering the ministry. These types of changes frequently lead to losses that can pile up and snowball creating anxiety; often trapping us in sadness, anger, fears, and uncertainty about the future.

Disengaged congregations fail to deal with these losses, ignore the reality of their losses, are burned out, and have difficulty moving forward.

However flexible congregations recognize the importance of caring for one another in a family of faith. They recognize what they have lost, take time to grieve, and use the memories of the past as a source of wisdom to build a vision for the future. Thinking about the past and the differences from today, recognizing how we have changed and continue to change helps move a church forward into the future.

The transition team will be starting by leading members and friends of the congregation in a period of self discovery where we will revisit the past, and our special memories, recognize how we have changed, celebrate our strengths and recognizing what makes KLC so special.

We will need everyone's help with this first stage of transition. We recognize that there will be different opinions and viewpoints, that people are at different stages in dealing with our losses, and that change can be difficult. It is vitally important that we hear all voices, and thoughts as we review our church history, including our losses, gains, and strengths. I can't begin to encourage you enough to fully participate and let your voice be heard.

Please watch for announcements about upcoming opportunities of different forums for sharing and gathering our thoughts and feelings regarding the past and moving forward into the future.

In the meantime, feel free to contact any member of the transition team with your thoughts, ideas, and questions.

Council Secretary's Report from the July 2023 Council Meeting

A regular meeting of the KLC Council was held virtually via Zoom with a quorum present. The meeting was opened with a devotion and prayer by Zel Terluin.

Pastor Ron Rucker reported that the transition team is getting started, and also we will hopefully have the choir back in the fall. The Sunday morning Adult Bible Study group is finishing up their study of Revelation and looking ahead to a new study. In the past month Pastor Ron has participated in the Sunday adult study, the Monday Faith Journey via Zoom, and Margarita Monday at the Maui Coast. The Men's Hui is hoping to start up again. Pastor also asked the council to consider what other programs and studies would be both desirable and feasible.

Administrative Assistant, Cate Evert, reported that the defibrillator needs a new battery. Zel Terluin offered to pay for it.

Treasurer, Margie Terluin, reported that the weekly giving deposited from 7/04 to 7/11 was \$10,379.00. Year-to-date income was \$155,231.37 and Year-to-date expenses were \$137,497.89.

The council appointed Ollie Stafford, Janet Harp and Debra Bowers to the audit team.

Pastor Ron Rucker reported that the parsonage electric bills have gone down.

For the Year 2023-2024, the council elected Zel Terluin as President, Renee Romerdahl as Vice-president, Sarah Dickmeyer as Secretary, and Margie Terluin as Treasurer.

The council voted to reinstate the choir director position beginning August 1, 2023 and to fund Pastor Ron's attendance at the Bishop's Retreat.

The next regular virtual meeting will be August 15, 2023 at 7:00 pm.


Here are a few suggestions of things you can do for August. We're sure you can think of other ways to be involved.




- Be part of the Stewardship Task Force to offer ideas for the 2024 campaign. Contact Marilyn or the office.


