Aloha from Pastor Ron,

PASTOR I have been reflecting on the months of August and September here on Maui and at KLC. There has been a little bit of bad or sad surrounded by a whole lot of good. Nanette and I ended August with a wonderful Bishop's retreat on Kauai. And then September took off with a bang. College football is back and I had the most amazing birthday celebration with several of my in-laws and many of the KLC 'ohana. Mahalo for your care. Now I am looking forward to the return of many of our "snowbirds."

Nanette leaves late Sunday, October 1st, to finish up the end-of-tax season in her office in Alaska. She will have a chance to finish up some of her clients in-person and assist with other returns needing to be done in the office. Of course, she will also have the chance for some children and grandchildren time just about halfway between their summer visit to Maui and their Christmas visit to Maui. Nanette returns October 16th and will be on furlough until just before Christmas. I believe her plan is to continue to work remotely from the parsonage.

We need information to determine who may or may not need a new members class and when we can receive members during a church service and have a new member lunch with the council.

The members of the Community Outreach and Assistance Team (COAT) continue to amaze me with their commitment and thoroughness. They are in the process of shifting to Phase 2 relief support which is a mid-term phase. Eventually they will shift to long-term relief support. I have signed on as a Disaster Spiritual Care Provider with the American Red Cross.

The first four informal surveys by the Transition Team yielded some very interesting and useful information. We are continuing a slow, deliberate approach to the transition process. There are some joint events between the Fellowship Team and the Transition Team in the next month. One will include an opportunity for small group, informal survey input. November will have some more formalized group input sessions. Our tentative, ultimate goal is to have the key transition process document called the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) completed and submitted by the end of January. That will move us from the transition stage to the call process. That means in January we should constitute the Call Committee. Contact Renee, the office or myself if you are interested in serving on the Call Committee.

Change is in the KLC future – period. We cannot go back and we certainly cannot stagnate. So let us move forward always remembering the words of Roy T. Bennett: "<u>The past is a place of reference, not a place of residence; the past is a place of learning, not a place of living.</u>"

President's REPORT

Presidents Message

The month of October is always a time at KLC when the Church Council reviews the proposed budget for the following year and the Stewardship Committee is busy

working to prepare for the annual stewardship campaign. I must admit that while growing up in the Lutheran Church I always disliked the annual stewardship drives and felt uncomfortable during them. The pleas to give reminded me of television evangelists and organizations asking us to reach deep into our pockets and give. It never seemed like the church was satisfied with the levels of giving. Yet, as I grew older and became more involved in the church I began to realize that everything we have is God's and that we are only giving back what is already His. I also learned the inner workings of the church, the financial budgets, spending, and how money is crucial for a church to do its ministry, and to keep the doors to the church open.

The last few years have been a difficult time for KLC in many ways, but especially financially. The previous two years, our expenditures were more than our income. Thankfully, this year we have been able to keep our expenditures within the amounts we have received. The ONLY reason that this has occurred is because our interim pastor has a lower salary and he does not require health insurance or a pension plan. So, we must all keep this in mind when we consider our giving since the current year does not reflect an accurate financial picture of KLC.

Our budget and expenses will increase with the call of a new pastor since the salary may be higher and we will need pay for health insurance and a pension plan. If we were doing that today, we would not have enough money. There are also additional expenses in calling a pastor, including airline flights, and moving expenses. We need to understand that we simply are going to need more income.

We all give in so many ways both with our time, talents, and monetary gifts. I still don't feel very comfortable during Stewardship Drives asking for money or with giving instructions during worship services on ways to give your offerings to KLC. However, the message needs to be given, heard and understood in order for our church to continue its great ministry.

Pledge cards are given out during the Stewardship Campaign as a way for you to make a commitment towards supporting our congregation. It allows you to plan for giving and add it to your budget. It is a response to God's gifts to us and a statement of thanksgiving. Sometimes your pledge may need to be revised due to personal circumstances. However, your pledge card still gives us an idea of what to expect from everyone and how to budget. As stated above, our expenses will be increasing. So, the question is, how will you help the ministry of our congregation with your finances?

During the past month I have heard from you about all the things you love about KLC. That we are a huge family that cares for one another and our community. That you are excited about the future, feel we are headed in the direction, and thankful to be here! Your financial pledge and commitment will help ensure this ministry will continue and flourish in the future!

Council Secretary's Report from the September 2023 Council Meeting

A regular meeting of the KLC church council was held virtually via Zoom with a quorum present. The meeting was opened with a devotion and prayer by Pastor Ron Rucker.

Pastor Ron Rucker has been visiting both church members and non-members offering them the sacraments if they desire. He has been meeting with a group of pastors here on Maui. Mel Eisenhart, of the Ohana and Keiki Exchange, shared with him that three groups are interested in doing pop-up distribution events with them and gave him a list of the specific items the exchange needs. He has spoken with Bishop Dave Naglar who is overseeing a potential grant for ongoing fire relief.

Treasurer Margie Terluin reported that the giving for the week of September 13 to 19 was \$6,932.02. Year-to-date income is \$205,010.39 and year-to-date expenses are \$190,930.23.

Property committee chair, Sue Moorcroft, reported that Dave Dewey is scheduled to look for the water leak in the irrigation system.

The transition team has finished the survey, is consolidating and will publish the results.

Keli and Vickie Nelson have purchased and will install a motion sensor solar light in the parking lot. Zel Terluin is going to seek bids to replace the non-working outdoor lighting.

The audit team has finished their reports.

The October noisy offering will go toward the Thanksgiving boxes for the Keolahou pantry.

There will be a gathering for the youth and young adults in July of 2024.

The next regular virtual meeting will be October 24, 2023 at 7:00 pm.

How Can I Help?


Here are a few suggestions of things you can do during October. We're sure you can think of other ways to be involved.


