ALOHA FROM PASTOR RON RUCKER



Aloha from Pastor Ron,

Jesus is risen. Alleluia, Jesus is risen indeed.

Now, I have been to the Lahaina area numerous times since the August fire, although I have not yet been into the downtown, heavily affected area of Lahaina. I have, however, seen reports that the Lahaina Banyan tree appears to be returning to life. I am reminded of Ash Wednesday when we talk of dust to dust and ashes to ashes. I am also reminded of the many fire ravaged forested areas I have driven through in Alaska and Canada only to see new growth, new life springing up out of the ashes. Finally, I also remember the spring ritual of burning grass yards and fields that combines dethatching and fertilizing so that the fields and yards green up and grow more quickly. Are these all indications that God's system is designed to perpetuate life from death? Possibly, at least I want to think so.

To the best of my knowledge, this congregation of KLC has a long history of supporting other community service organizations: the Keolahou Food Pantry (KFP), the Kihei Youth Center (KYC), and the Ohana Klothing Exchange (OKE) formerly known as the Keiki Klothing Exchange (KKE). We have also had individual members assisting with and volunteering at three other community service organizations: A Cup of Cold Water (CCW), Feed My Sheep (FMS), and Maui Rescue Mission (MRM). Since the fires, each of these organizations has experienced an increase in clientele and needs. Shortly after the fires, we began supporting a new relief organization, Kelawea Mauka Lahaina (KML). In fact, we requested, received and have now depleted a six-month \$20,000 grant from Lutheran Disaster Response specifically to support KML. All of this and all of the other fire response funds KLC received required us to create a Fire Response Team (FRT). With promise of support from Synod Fire Response funds, the FRT embarked on identifying and procuring a satisfactory van for the use of KML in their ongoing services to eliminate the expense and need for renting vans. That van project is fully operational now. Part of the Fire Response Team on behalf of the entire FRT met with three representatives from the Lutheran Disaster Response organization. With their quidance, the FRT is communicating with all seven of these community service organizations to identify needs and estimated costs for the coming year. The FRT is intending to submit a new year-long grant proposal to Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR). Currently, we are estimating a grant request of about \$112,000 dollars. Additionally, we still have fire relief funds that were donated directly to KLC that we are using for emergency and unplanned expenses such as the twenty cases totaling 800 bottles of water already provided recently to CCW. Your FRT and your Community Outreach and Assistance Team (COAT) are hard at work serving those in need for any reason on Maui. What a blessing to be a part of this exciting ministry.

We all experience drama or trauma in our lives that causes us to feel burned up or even dead. But just as Jesus was raised from the dead, just as the Banyan tree and fields have new life, God is able and willing to create new life from the ashes and dust that we wallow in. We just have to let God be God.

Council Secretary's Report from the March 2024 Council Meeting

A regular meeting of the KLC church council was held via Zoom with a quorum present. The meeting was opened with a devotion and prayer by Sue Moorcroft.

Pastor Ron Rucker reported Kiley picked up the new van for Kelawea Mauka. We donated 20 cases of water to A Cup of Cold Water and will be helping them with more things along the way. Passion week is coming fast.

Treasurer Margie Terluin reported that giving for the week of March 10 was \$5,851.08. Year-to-date income is \$72,509.09 and year-to-date expenses are \$63,758.37. Balance of the Fire Relief Fund is \$46,824.02. The mortgage after the paydown from February is now \$287,351.07.

There are 4 people who are willing to serve on council. They are Rhonda Stoltzfus (off-island representative), Marty Atrops, Laura McClellan, and Marilyn Hopkins will complete Dave Ballaine's final year. These individuals will be voted in at the congregational meeting in April.

There is still more discussion to be had with OKE but there may be new solutions coming in the near future.

The congregational meeting date was approved for April 14th right after service.

The kitchen air conditioner is in disrepair and will be replaced instead of just fixed.

Next regular meeting will be April 16th, 2024, at 7:00 om to be held virtually.

We will be asking for help throughout the year to provide items that are needed to carry out their important ministries in our Maui Communities.

Last Monday Pastor Ron drove Zel and Margie to A Cup Of Cold Water (in Wailuku, where he skillfully parked) and 20 cases of water were delivered to Marilyn (the ACCW coordinator), who was thrilled to receive them since their normal supplier was out of water. It was a GOD thing.

It was Pastor Ron's last time to drive the van as it was turned over to Kiley Adolpho from Kelawea Mauka this past week to use for the delivery of fruits, vegetables and daily meals to the people in the Kelawea neighborhood in Lahaina. The license plate on the van is 739 TXG which was deemed "Thanks God", for the many blessings and opportunities KLC has been provided to serve those on Maui and all over. This includes donations from the Prayer Shawl Ministry.

COAT is making 60 snack bags to be delivered this upcoming week to ACCW using food purchased at Costco by Hilary and Margie. This will be placed in specially designed paper bags done by our Sunday School youth. (Thanks, Dori for including this in your lesson plan and to the Keiki who helped.) There will be more forthcoming. Thank you for continuing to support Community.








