Aloha from Pastor Ron,



The Transition/Call process is still on hold until this month's council meeting on August 20th. In a similar vein, I want to let you know that Lihue Lutheran Church voted to call Pastor David Hendrickson on July 14th. Pastor Dave and his wife Yen have been living on Oahu where he has been serving as a Chaplain. Congratulations.

As I write this, I am waiting to have a zoom meeting with Lutheran Disaster Response directors. As Margie Terluin and I have been out and about in the Maui fires related community distributing the funds from Our \$180,000 LDR grant, it came to my attention of many greater needs. I will be discussing with the LDR directors whether additional funding seems appropriate and what might be the best way to secure it.

Speaking of the LDR grant and our bus. MEL and other Ohana Strong (formerly OKE and KKE) leaders and volunteers have begun some minor repairs for leaking windows and planned modifications for the buses eventual use as a mobile distribution and storage vehicle. This will facilitate the Ohana Strong program serving the entire community and island of Maui.

HYGIENE BAG ASSEMBLY

As we begin our new quarterly schedule to work on projects for our new ministry partner, Feed My Sheep, Hilary, Marcia, Nancy and Marilyn met on July 9th to make 50 hygiene bags. They assembled 25 lady's bags and 25 men's. The bags contain a hand towel, wash cloth, soap, shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, feminine products for the ladies and a razor kit for the men. Although we still have a lot of donated items available, extra items needed for these ongoing projects have been funded by the ELCA Lutheran Disaster Response. Our ministry partners are experiencing a real surge in numbers as more and more of the Lahaina fire survivors still lack permanent housing and are seeking alternative ways to live. They continue to need our help. Please consider volunteering to help Community Outreach with their projects.







GRANT FUND DISTRIBUTIONS

During the month of July, Pastor Ron and Margie had the opportunity to bless some of our ministry partners with checks provided by the ELCA Lutheran Disaster Response grant program. Marilyn and Susie from A Cup of Cold Water, Lehua with Pastor Ron from the Kihei Youth Center and Aloha with the wonderful volunteers from the Keolahou Food Pantry were all touched by the generous donations they were given. The additional donations will be used to help cover costs they are all still facing since the onset of the August 8th fires due to increased number of people in need. We at Kihei Lutheran along with our partner volunteers are very grateful to the LDR for their generosity here on Maui, the mainland, and worldwide.




