In addition to our normal God's Work Our Hands, the ELCA is celebrating its 50th year of World Hunger on October 16th. ALOHA FROM PASTOR RON RUCKER

Aloha from Pastor Ron,

Nanette and I are thoroughly enjoying our time here in Maui. We have come to love being in Kihei and we love being a part of the KLC ohana. You have accepted us and you care for us as ohanas do. Our reality, however, is that we cannot stay here forever even if we want to. So, there will come a time when we return to our family in Alaska. The following picture is of most of our Alaskan family and 3 members of my family from the mainland at my ordination 6 years ago. On August 20th, the date of the council meeting last month, this picture and one of Nanette's mother, Ruth, with 3 of her grand-children were posted, which was the 6th anniversary of Nanette's mother's arrival in God's arms, just 16 short days after my ordination. Ruth is sitting in the wheelchair next to me, holding my hand.



The primary purpose of the June council meeting was to approve the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) and appoint the call committee. Earlier in June, Bishop Dave Nagler indicated to me that he could accept some type of term call, for a specified time, for Nanette and I here at KLC. The council responded positively zeroing in on a 4-year term call. The council postponed action on the MSP and the call committee so that they and Nanette and I could go through a discernment process until the next council meeting, which turned out to be the August 20th meeting. After much prayer and conversation, lots of vacillation back and forth, we came to the conclusion that there were two huge negatives outweighing all the positives. The first negative was that Nanette and I could possibly miss all but one year, if not all, of our oldest granddaughter's middle school and high school years. The second negative was what pastor looking for a call that might be right for KLC would be missed during the years of the term call.

And so, with trepidation, I said to the council that Nanette and I decided we should continue with the month-to-month extensions of my current interim contract until KLC finds the right pastor to call. We reiterated our commitment to stay here in this journey with the KLC ohana until a pastor is called. The meeting ran long and so approval of the MSP and appointment of the Call Committee was postponed again until the September council meeting. The transition and call process is continuing to move forward.

Nanette and I dearly love each and every one of you. This has been a 50-year dream come true for me. I can't imagine leaving here and you, but I know it will come to pass. I preach often about trusting God and ultimately that is what you and we have to do. God has a plan and we have faith.

fus. We are very grateful for their willingness to serve the congregation. Officers are Renee Romerdahl, president, Sue Moorcroft, vice president, Vicki Nelson/Rhonda Stolzfus, co-secretaries. Margie Terluin has graciously agreed to serve as treasurer. She is not a council member but attends council meetings as KLC's treasurer.

Many of you are wondering where we are in the call process. We started to form the Call Committee in June, but postponed it so that Pastor Ron could consider taking a term call to serve as KLC's pastor. The Council agreed to this postponement and to reconvene in August to hear his decision and move forward. After much contemplation and prayer, Pastor Ron and Nanette decided it was in everyone's best interest that he not take a term call. He will instead continue to serve as our interim pastor during the call process.

Next steps; we will finalize the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) and the Call Committee this month. Pastor JP, Assistant to the Bishop, will set a meeting time with the Church Council, Transition Team, and Call Committee to review the MSP and then it will be activated. Pastor JP will be available to assist the Call Committee in beginning their work once the MSP is activated.

The Call Committee will then begin to work together to identify the candidate who is best suited to lead us into God's future. The Call Committee will look for the "right" candidate to call based on our mission, vision, and needs. They will not be looking for a clone or an innocuous person to hire. They will not have a predetermined mindset about the next minister. It may take a short time, or a very long time before the Call Committee finds our next pastor. We must be patient for God to send the "right" pastor to us. Only HE knows our future and HIS plans for us.

Please to keep KLC in your prayers at this time as we move forward.


Sunday School to Begin


