ALOHA FROM PASTOR RON RUCKER

Aloha from Pastor Ron,

Last month both Renee Romerdahl, President of the Congregation, and I wrote about change coming to KLC. What many of you may not know is that both of us had written our letters **prior** to learning that Beth and Cate were planning to leave KLC and Maui for Minnesota. So, the coming change for KLC is much greater than we anticipated but it does not change the facts that first and foremost God is leading the way because God has a plan for KLC. Second, change is never necessarily bad unless we choose to let the change become bad. KLC has a great group of leaders and a congregation willing to get into the nitty-gritty when needed. Your leaders are already looking at what we have done in years gone by compared to what we have been doing in more recent years. This is a great time to relook at needs, processes, structures and, of course, wants. If you or somebody you know might be interested in helping accompany worship on Sundays, leading choir or chimes, picking hymns, and selecting worship liturgy, let us know. The same thing applies to administration and procedures. And while I am mentioning it, there is a nominating committee looking for members to be on the church council. And, even if you don't want to be on council, KLC needs more people to volunteer to help with the many different teams and activities being offered at KLC such as administration, fellowship, finance, outreach, property, spiritual gifts (stewardship), spiritual growth (education both adult and children), and worship. As we have been learning the last few weeks, we all have gifts and interests and it is important for us to make those available to our congregation, our ohana. It just takes a conversation, email, phone call, or text to get involved.

A pastor friend of mine recently shared this meme with the comment following.

When you learn how to sit at the table with your Judas, you'll understand the love of Jesus Christ.

So very hard. I've sat with a couple, but they would be surprised that I think of them that way. That is the problem though - Judas didn't think of himself as a Judas either. I struggle with the thought that Judas is lost and unforgivable; right now I don't believe that.

I can tell you that this has been and continues to be an area of growth for me this last year. When I think about Jesus and the disciples in that upper room, Jesus is talking and teaching, and then Jesus washes the disciples' feet including Judas' in an act of complete servitude, and then Jesus follows it up with the first Eucharist, Holy Communion, including Judas once again. It seems to make the idea of forgiving and repenting among many other "requirements" for partaking in the Eucharist a little, if you will, ridiculous. Similar dogma, requirements, and traditions were what Jesus took issue with the Pharisees about. It is why I am so adamant about the Eucharist being the gift of God, hosted by God, and that all – **absolutely all** – should be welcome.

Call Committee Update

The KLC Call Committee met with Pastor JP Sabbithi and had our mock interview on January 3, 2025. Pastor JP is the regional assistant for Hawaii to the Pacifica Synod and to Bishop Dave Nagler. We can now confirm that (as of this writing), the committee has received three Rostered Minister Profiles (candidates) for our review. We are also working with Pastor JP on securing other interested candidates. As we review the profiles, we will discern which candidate(s) we will interview. Virtual inter-

views of candidates will begin mid-February 2025. The Call Committee will continue to update the congregation as developments occur and as allowed by the Synod. Your prayers and support are appreciated. Call Committee members are Marty Atrops, Andrea Harris, Laura McClellan, Sue Moorcroft, Phil Proctor (chair), and Margie Terluin.

Council Secretary's Report from the January 2025 Council Meeting



A regular meeting of the KLC church council was held in person with a quorum present. The meeting was opened with a devotion and prayer by Vicki Nelson.

Pastor Ron Rucker reported that finances and attendance is trending up. He feels the congregation is in more the right place than in many areas.

Treasurer Margie Terluin reported that the giving for the week of January 14 was \$3,303.01. Year-to-date income is \$13,909.04 and year-to-date expenses are \$9,417.91. The balance in the General Fund as of 12/31 is \$84,052.37.

Congregational reports are due 1/24/25.

Preschool contract was discussed and approved to renew the contract for another year.

The agenda for the February 23rd congregational meeting was approved.

The nominating committee will be comprised of council members whose terms are up. They will be approved at the congregational meeting. The hope is to get 2 people from the congregation to help with this, but if that is not possible, there are enough members going off council to search for new council members.

It was voted to approve a land recognition statement for our church bulletin. This thanks the Hawaiian people for use of the land for our church building.

The staffing changes were discussed and council was asked over the next month to think about what the positions of administrative assistant and music coordinator would want to look like. It could be different than what is currently in place.

A long discussion was had about property needs. Things have fallen by the wayside with both the church property and the parsonage. Before we get a new pastor, some things need to be addressed. The sooner things are looked at the less expensive it will be.

The next regular meeting will be February 19th at 6:00 p.m. in person.


