Aloha from Pastor Ron,




First, let people know who you are and who you stand for in no uncertain terms.

Second, at the end of service on Sunday, February 23<sup>rd</sup>, I gave some ballpark summary numbers about what KLC has been doing since the August 2023 fires. I think Margie does a phenomenal job leading all our outreach efforts and providing detailed information on what we do. I have in several conversations provided these ballpark dollar figures with a common response – why don't we hear this. Not only did you get a chance to hear them, but now you can see them in writing. KLC is roughly a half million dollar relief agency. We have received grants for approximately \$300,000 from Lutheran Disaster Response, \$100,000 from the Pacifica Synod Disaster funds, and slightly over \$100,000 in direct donations to KLC for disaster relief. These are hard dollars and do not account for all the in-kind donations of food and products we have received since the fires from around Canada and the United States. The vast majority of the funds have been distributed directly to eight agencies hands-on serving in the trenches so to speak. We have retained some funds for purchasing food and supplies for our hands on service projects like PBJ sandwiches, hygiene bags, and food that our distributed by others. All of our grants expire in May. We are currently evaluating whether a need exists for additional funds prior to May, and what funds we think we should be requesting for projects beyond May.

Third, our Congregational Report from February 23<sup>rd</sup> shows that for the second year in a row out of six years reported, our income has exceeded our expenses. Well done you good and faithful servants. Additionally, our average attendance numbers are trending up slightly.

Our world has changed and continues to change. For us, that means we need to trust God, love God, and love others. And one more thing, we must continue to serve others, so with that in mind, I leave you with these words from Dietrich Bonhoeffer.

# **Presidents Message**

As members of Kihei Lutheran Church we know and understand that WE are the church, it is not the building that is the church. However, our building provides a place for us to worship and serve God through our ministry and programs. We haven't always been fortunate to have a church building. For many years we worshiped in the cafeteria at Kihei Elementary school. Each Sunday everything was hauled out of a storage shed and then put away again for the following Sunday; chairs, Rubbermaid containers with supplies, a sound system, electric piano, Sunday school supplies, etc. Prior to that time church was held at beach parks and homes. We have come along way since 1987 when Kihei Lutheran was first organized.

PRESIDENT'S

It is our responsibility to be good stewards of our church properties. We must maintain the church, surrounding property, and the parsonage. We have a property committee that oversees these properties and their maintenance, making sure everything is in working order. For many years Sue Moorcroft has been the chair of the property committee. Her dedication and service has been greatly appreciated. The membership of the committee has changed throughout the years, and has recently dwindled. Our property team currently consists of Sue and our a council representative Mark Haley. We NEED members on the property committee!!

I believe there is a misunderstanding of what is expected of property committee members. If you serve on the property committee you are not expected to know carpentry, plumbing, or gardening or be a handyman/woman, or electrician. What is expected is that you care for our properties, by insuring that they are taken care of and well maintained. The property committee keeps record of what needs repairing, arranges for bids from tradespeople, and arranges for the repairs. They also organize work parties for volunteers to help with simple tasks such as gardening. If you love our church, then you are qualified to serve on the property committee.

The council has recently been made aware of multiple repairs and maintenance that needs to be done to both the church property and the parsonage. A prioritized list is being created, we are asking for bids, and we are working on financing. The church irrigation system is currently going through repairs, which will help with our water loss and water bills. The parsonage roof is leaking in two places, the slider glass doors are broken and need to be replaced, there are windows that also need replacements and the master bedroom is missing closet doors. These are the top priorities right now, but there are other items that need tackling as well. We must maintain our properties and it is our job to take care of them.

Please consider volunteering to serve on the church property committee. You can speak to Sue or Mark if you would like more information or would like to help the property committee. Also, please let them know if you know a roofer or contractor that you would like to recommend.

# Council Secretary's Report from the February 2025 Council Meeting



A regular meeting of the KLC church council was held in person with a quorum present. The meeting was opened with a devotion and prayer by Sue Moorcroft.

Pastor Ron Rucker reported that we have 2 people who would like to become members. Jeane Raine's service will be presided over by Ron with Dave Krueger giving the homily. We also have two baptisms the following Sunday for the Handley's grandchildren. He is working hard on separation of former pastors and current members.

Treasurer Margie Terluin reported that the giving for the week of February 18th was \$8,854. Year-to-date income is \$50,794.77 and year-to-date expenses are \$40,158.12. The balance in the General Fund as of 2/18 is \$90,110.25.

We had security tech replace a motion sensor in the back that was going off randomly. Hopefully that will stop false alarms and calls. We also will need a roach treatment in the kitchen area.

Discussion was had about reviewing the housing compensation package for the new pastor. This needs to be thought about as we also work through other staffing changes. Cate feels that her main job can be done with 19 hours a week and a possible 4 day work week. Cate is hoping to be a possible on call position and be done in the office June 6<sup>th</sup> but on call until 30<sup>th</sup> of June. Someone needs to be in place by May 26<sup>th</sup> to have adequate time to train. The music position was discussed and it was decided the church really needs a keyboard person to start. It may have to be subs to start off with until we are able to find a permanent solution.

The policy about hiring church members was changed. All contractors will be hired through a bidding process.

Property needs was talked about especially things having to do with the parsonage. New closet doors, roof, sliding doors (2 don't work), trim painted and the inside painted are just among some of the issues. Laura will spearhead a team to take a look at the previous reserve study to incorporate what needs to be done with suggestions on what we should be doing year to year.

A personnel committee/task force will be discussed at the next meeting and the committees will have a promotional fair after the April congregational meeting.

The preschool requested watering more frequently. Other suggestions were given for them to move things around so that the grass wouldn't get as bad. A letter will be sent to the school with suggestions.

The next regular meeting will be March 18<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. via Zoom.








# **Community Outreach**

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
