#### ALOHA FROM PASTOR RON RUCKER



Aloha from Pastor Ron,

Happy Easter. Jesus is risen. Jesus is risen indeed. Alleluia.

Since we have six more Sundays in the season of Easter, I thought we should continue to focus on prevalent Easter themes. Is the cross or the empty tomb most important in the life of Jesus and our **own** faith journeys? As I said on Easter, if our God is a God of judgment and punishment, then the cross is most important to us. The cross is where Jesus was the sacrificial lamb paying God's required sacrifice for the forgiveness of our sin. It sure seems to me like a pretty high price to pay, one's own child, just to meet a sacrificial requirement. Yet, that is what many, many Christians believe. On the other hand, if our God is a God of love, then the empty tomb is a symbol of God's love that says there is more to life than death, and that is most important to other Christians. As usual, they are just different perspectives.

That being said, I think it is important for us to continue to focus on Jesus. After all, we call ourselves Christians after Jesus Christ. Who was Jesus? What did Jesus do? What happened to Jesus? The answers to these and other similar questions are found in the gospels. Yes, the entire Bible is important but it must be read through the lens of Jesus in the gospels. I find the following from Barbara Brown Taylor to be an interesting summary of the story of Jesus: "Jesus was not killed by atheism and anarchy. Jesus was brought down by law and order allied with religion—which is always a deadly mix. Beware of those who claim to know the mind of God and are prepared to use force, if necessary, to make others conform. Beware of those who cannot tell God's will from their own."

The Call Committee continues to work on finding a more permanent pastor for KLC. Ohana Strong also continues to try to get the bus moved to a maintenance shop so that it can be made ready to serve the population of Maui. I am sure you often wonder what is happening, if anything. I'm more in the know and I still wonder. It reminds me of the story about how government decisions are made is like elephants mating. It is done at a high level with lots of screaming and it takes two years to get results.

Nanette and I continue to love and be loved, and to support and be supported. This has been one of our most treasured experiences in our lives together. I am looking forward to working with a new council and new staff if only, maybe, for a brief time.

### Council Secretary's Report from the April 2025 Council Meeting

Council

A regular meeting of the KLC church council was held via Zoom with a quorum present. The meeting was opened with a devotion and prayer by Sue Moorcroft

Pastor Ron Rucker reported that he has been to Hale Makua to visit a nonmember, John, who requests communion every once and a while. He also stopped by the church when the Tongans were here to thank them for the Palm Sunday decorations.

Treasurer Margie Terluin reported that the giving for the week of April 15th was \$6,318.34. Year-to-date income is \$105,023.73, and year-to-date expenses are \$84,236.47. The balance in the General Fund as of 4/15 is \$102,794.86.

Cate reported that she is continuing to work on writing procedures for things that she does.

Outreach gave an update of items delivered to Keolahou, some wish list items that were delivered to the youth center, and Margie went with A Cup of Cold Water to deliver 160 sandwiches.

Ohana strong gave an update that the Easter event was well attended. The bus is empty and hopefully will be moved for repairs soon. The van is now full and will be moved once the bus is up and running.

A personnel committee/task force had met twice. Job descriptions were made for both the Administrative Assistant and the pianist. We will begin advertising soon. They want the church to consider hiring a sextant to do all the other duties that do not fall under the Administrative Assistant but have been getting done because of Cate.

Nominating Committee reported that two people are willing to join council. They will be searching for more. Marilyn will make an announcement this Sunday. Pastor Ron suggested that we should also start forming the audit committee now for next year.

Committee Team/Promotional Fair will be held on May 4<sup>th</sup> after the congregational meeting. Teams need to look at the constitution to see what they are supposed to be doing as teams.

John and Nancy Norman have been accepted as new members.

A new church credit card was discussed. Margie will look into ELCA Federal Credit Union that we were working with the prior to Covid.

An audit was discussed and it was recommended that with all the changes and people leaving that we will hold off this year and an audit will be done early next year.

The next regular meeting will be May 20th at 7:00 p.m. via Zoom.


#### ATTENTION KLC CONGREGATION


